The Church and Coronavirus

How our community has changed in two weeks! On Wednesday, March 11, I met with clergy colleagues in North Haven. We discussed the suggestions of limiting the size of gatherings in response to the rise of COVID-19, and I told them I hadn't considered cancelling services. The next day, Thursday, March 12, was the day I received the recommendation of the Southern New England Conference to suspend in-church worship services. In the last two weeks, the limited size of gatherings has gone from 250 to 100 to 50 to 10. Presently, we are asked to "Stay Safe, Stay Home" and to avoid groups altogether. On Sunday, March 15, we held our first online worship service.

This situation presents a rather shocking and uncomfortable challenge to our accustomed routine as a congregation. Gathering for worship in the sanctuary is when we feel most like "church." The opportunity for soothing and up lifting music, for reassuring words from the scriptures, and prayer brings us comfort and hope. Many of us can remember gathering in the aftermath of tragedy to seek comfort and strength together. We are asked now to observe social distancing to reduce the speed of the spread of the virus, and we have decided to give up gathering for worship together in the sanctuary for the time being.

We have discovered together that we can gather, from our various locations, and worship together in an online service. Through the technological expertise and advice of Mark Bessette and the foresight and coordination of Julie Schweickert, we were well-prepared to make the shift to live streaming our worship service from the sanctuary on March 15. Many of you have commented on your gratitude for the service, and your enjoyment in gathering. I am grateful to Julie and to Mark, and to Gary Snowbeck, Jeff Hutchins, and Karlee Etter for their assistance in the preparation and leadership of our worship services the last two Sundays.

The future requirements in response to COVID-19 are uncertain. We will continue to gather as we are able, and to offer prayer and encouragement to each other. I urge you to take hold of the hope that is ours, as faithful followers of Jesus Christ, and to share that hope with your loved ones and your neighbors. God bless you and keep you.

Coronavirus Precautions At Church Worship Services Live Streaming

Online! Thanks to fortuitous planning and lots of hard work by Mark Bessette and Paul Powers, we were able to make a seamless switch to live streamed worship services online beginning March 15. All worship services will be live streamed online, through the Church website – Sundays at 9:30am and special services as scheduled. In-church worship services are suspended through at least Sunday, April 12. It is quite possible that this suspension will be extended. We will update the congregation on worship details weekly by email and voicemail

Church Building Is Closed and outside groups are cancelled through at least Saturday, April 18. This closure may be extended. The Church Office is currently open Monday – Friday 8:00am-2:30pm, and the Food Pantry is open by appointment Monday-Friday 10-11am. Anyone who needs food during these uncertain times can simply call the Church Office.

All Church Groups and meetings are encouraged to meet online via ZOOM, email or telephone. In-church group activities and meetings are cancelled through at least Saturday, April 18. This cancellation may be extended.

Message from Director at Silver Lake We hope this email finds you and your family healthy and calm in this anxious time. In light of the coronavirus (COVID-19) outbreak, we are writing today to share with you the steps Silver Lake is taking to ensure that our campers and guests stay healthy.

At this time, Silver Lake has opted to close to retreat groups for 30 days. This is in line with current recommendations and procedures from our state government. Affected retreat groups have been notified. We have canceled our Maple Sugaring weekend and refunded all participants. We are hoping to reschedule our Counselor Retreat and Women's Yoga and Music Spirit Retreat, and will send out more information about that when we are able to.

Summer camp is still more than three months away, which is a very long time when dealing with a health issue like COVID-19. We at Silver Lake are monitoring the situation closely and will follow the advice of the state agencies that regulate summer camps and the American Camp Association (ACA). We will take every precaution possible to ensure that camp is safe by the time our summer session begins. We will continually evaluate our practices, incorporating new information and best practices as they become available to us.

With the help of our Medical Director, we are updating our current health policies and screenings, adapting them to ensure camper health. Silver Lakes uses a peroxide sanitizer that is approved by the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) for use in controlling the Coronavirus. We will continue our regular sanitizing of sleeping and communal areas, and add a focus on doorknobs, light switches, and other high-touch areas. We will continue to follow industry standards in our food preparation, which includes a staff member who is ServSafe certified.

As we modify policies or learn new information, we will communicate what we know with you. We hope to send email updates on a regular basis, and we will post them on our Facebook page as well. We have also created a page on our website, www.silverlakect.org/coronavirus, where we will post updates and policy changes.

As a reminder, our summer camp cancelation policy is to refund payments made above the nonrefundable deposit. If it becomes necessary to cancel sessions, we will inform you of any changes to the cancelation policy.

In addition to the page on the Silver Lake website, the Southern New England Conference has compiled a very useful and up-to-date resource page at www.sneucc.org/coronavirus.

If you are unsure of what is helpful to say to your camper(s) or you notice they are struggling with the stress of this situation, the National Association of School Psychologists has put together Talking to Children about COVID-19 (Coronavirus): A Resource for Parents .

We hope that everyone is staying safe and keeping busy during this difficult time. We will use our social media accounts (Facebook: @SilverLakeCT; Instagram: silverlakeconfcenter) to share resources for families who are at home while schools are closed. Silver Lake has lots of fun activities to share, and maybe home school can be a little bit more like camp.

We are looking forward to happy and healthy summer 2020 program at Silver Lake!
