A Shut-Down Take-Away

These are very unusual times. In the weeks since March 12th we have seen the shutdown of schools, colleges and universities, and large public gatherings. Many businesses, particularly those involving close personal contact, are closed. Other businesses remain open, with employees working from home. In Connecticut, the public has been asked to Stay Safe, Stay Home, and to wear masks when venturing out in public. The customary routine for so many has been completely disrupted: no in-person meetings, no dining out in restaurants, no sports events, no performing arts events, not much shopping, and very little hanging out in-person.

The church has certainly been affected: there have been no in-person meetings, choir rehearsals, Coffee Hours, Fellowship Breakfasts, or Sunday School classes. It has been seven Sundays since we last gathered in the sanctuary together at 9:30am.

This is a lonely, cooped-up, sad time. Most of us are deprived, in some way, of the personal contact that means family and neighborhood, joy and love and adventure. It is easy to name the people and places and activities we miss. My guess is that, for many of us, there are also bright spots in the midst of socialdistancing and shutdown.

First, many of us can recognize there are others around us who are in circumstances much more dire and difficult than our own. Some have lost jobs; some have businesses that are shutdown and have responsibilities for employees. Some are required to work amid circumstances that are not safe. Some are essential workers in the very center of the crisis: healthcare workers, emergency responders, social workers and advocates. Second, some of us may appreciate a slower, more spacious pace of life and work. There may be time for walks, or gardening, or listening to music, or reading poetry. I have enjoyed sitting down to dinner, together with Carol, instead of passing through and passing by at different times.

Third, many of us may have a heightened appreciation for the comforting and soothing moments we have been accustomed to taking for granted. The sound of tree frogs in the evening, and birdsong in the morning. Sunsets and sunrises. Flowers and budding leaves and clouds. A wave, a smile, a friendly crinkling of the eyes above a mask. A handwritten note in the mailbox. A picture left on the dining room table. Deeper listening and conversations that are more attentive conversations.

I urge you to pay attention to these bright spots and the gratitude they prompt in your heart. How will we choose to live differently as a result of this time of separation, this trauma, this challenge?

The New Normal

On March 8th, one of the last Sundays we worshipped together before Social Distancing, Scott preached his sermon on "How God sees the World". He asked, how do we think God sees the world and said his own first thought was the Blue Marble photo from the Space Capsule. But then, he said, he thought that was too distant and decided that Google Earth was more the way that he thought God sees the world – with that ability to zoom in. (Hmm, wonder if that was prophetic, seeing as we are doing so much in Zoom meetings these days?)

The image that immediately came to my mind was of my 3 year old son. We were in Maine visiting Ken's folks and Uncle Earl invited us to come see the slides he had taken when he and Aunt Beryl spent the previous winter in my hometown, San Antonio. A bed sheet was hung on the wall for the screen and the first slide was a panoramic view of the city at dusk. No sooner was the slide up than Brian yelled "Mac Don-oos!" It took us adults several minutes to find those Golden Arches that he saw immediately. We were distracted by the lights and the skyline all over that big sheet but Brian was focused on what was important to him.

I take great comfort envisioning God that focused on each of us. The temptation is often strong to think that there are bigger problems that God must be focused on. Certainly this Covid-19 coronavirus must require God's full attention; there are so many infected all over the world and there are not enough tests, masks, ventilators, beds or even medical personnel to deal with the crisis. Tornados and flooding make the dire situation even worse. To add to the trouble, Africa is suffering a plague of locusts eating what little food they were able to grow. There are already refugees suffering in crowed, unsanitary camps and the list goes on and on. But the Bible tells us "Don't be afraid." How many times does that occur in Scripture? According to Quora "Words like 'do not be afraid', 'fear not', etc. occur over three hundred times in the Bible and arguably 365 times, one for every day of the year." I don't know if that includes those scriptures that tell us to "Trust in the Lord" but I know that at the darkest time of my life I was shown a scripture verse that helped me then and has continued to see me through difficult times even to this day. My verse is Isaiah 41:10 "Fear nothing, for I am with you; be not afraid, for I am your God. I strengthen you, I help you, I support you with my victorious right hand." My God is with me, focused on me, helping and supporting me – and at the same time God is focused that same way on each of us. "Do not fear, for I have redeemed you; I have summoned you by name; you are mine." ((Isaiah 43:1)

Do you have a Scripture verse that strengthens you? If not, I offer one more from that list of 365 – Isaiah 12:2.

Anyone who needs food during these uncertain times can simply call the Church Office.

encouraged to meet online via ZOOM, email or telephone. In-church group activities and meetings are cancelled until further notice.

there was only one set of footprints.

I don't understand why, when I needed You the most, You would leave me."

He whispered, "My precious child, I love you and will never leave you

Never, ever, during your trials and testings.

When you saw only one set of footprints,

It was then that I carried you."

Feel free to re-read this poem whenever you feel the need to do so. But most importantly, remember that God has not abandoned us. He is with us, right beside each and every one of us, holding your hand or carrying you.

I know that since March 15, many or you have joined Pastor Scott and me during our Live-Streaming worship every Sunday morning and I hope you continue to do so. Likewise, as I have done during the past six weeks, I will continue to send families an abbreviated version of church school lessons which

- 1. Visit the App Store or Google Play and search for "GivePlus Church" to download the app for free.
- 2. Simply type in the church's name or click "Find Churches Near Me" to select **North Haven Congregational Church.**

This convenience comes at a small cost to the church. If you choose to use eGiving, you will have the opportunity to offset the fees: 1% for ACH (Automated Clearing House, using your bank routing number and account number) and 2.75% for credit cards. This is a voluntary step that you can choose at the time of your payment.

Payroll Protection Plan

Through careful and hard work by Julie & Adam Schweickert and John Tibor, the Church completed and submitted an application for a Payroll Protection Program loan through the CARES act. This loan will be applied toward payroll and some benefits, and it will be forgiven if all employees continue on the payroll. The loan was approved, though it was not funded in the first round. We are hopeful the loan will be funded in the second round.



OASIS YOUTH GROUP And MULTI-CHURCH CONFIRMATION CLASS

All previously scheduled OASIS Youth, Confirmation, and $5^{\text{th}}-7^{\text{th}}$ grade activities are cancelled until further notice. Zoom gatherings and activities are being scheduled occasionally, and will be announced through email. If you are concerned that you are NOT receiving OASIS emails, please contact Scott or Julie.

Confirmation Update

Confirmation is scheduled for May 31st! Although the scheduled activities for Confirmation have been cancelled, there are some new assignments and online experiences for Confirmands to participate in and complete. We will email details and help you to stay connected. We are still planning to have Confirmation Sunday on May 31st in person in our respective churches, and we are prepared with a backup plan if it is needed.

How Does Online Livestreaming Worship Happen?

You need a camera - a very special camera. Ours is located in the rear of the

sanctuary, just above the door where you come in. The camera can swivel back and forth and up and down, and it can take a wide angle picture or zoom in for a more closeup shot. It looks like this:



1) Livestreaming was

planned at the end of last year by Julie Schweickert, Mark Bessette, and Paul Powers and implemented during January and February. They installed the camera, pulled cables in the attic and connected the camera at the back of the sanctuary, the audio system in the front of the sanctuary and the server in the copy room. This implementation also required new software to be utilized. They created a Youtube channel for the church and purchased software to enable saving of the video to play back at a later date.

 You need a camera operator. The camera is controlled by Mark Bessette or Julie Schweickert. Julie does the controlling from her office computer at the church; Mark controls the camera remotely from his home. Both Julie and Mark have operated the camera and the streaming and recording of worship services. Mark's recording studio at home:



 You want to have music. Since late March, the music for the services has been prerecorded. First our Organist, Gary Snowbeck, records preludes and postludes and hymns on



the organ he plays at home. Gary has recorded some of these pieces on his iPhone, and more recently on a tablet. He emails the recordings as sound files to Jeff Hutchins, Director of Music, Julie Schweickert and

Scott Morrow. Jeff converts Gary's sound files from the original format to a format that works in the media player on Scott's laptop. For hymns, Jeff records a voice-over with his singing – sometimes he records three tracks so he is singing the tenor, alto, and baritone parts at the same time! Additionally, Jeff has been pulling recordings of the Chancel Choir in past performances for the anthems on Sundays. Occasionally he has recorded an anthem the Chancel Choir was already preparing to sing together before the shutdown. Some of these recordings have featured Nicole Brewer, Jeff's wife, singing was well. This process of converting files and recording voice-overs involves transferring files to the cloud, with further recording and refining before the files are sent to Julie and Scott. Jeff's recording set-up looks like this:



- 4) The bulletin is prepared, including the text of the scripture readings and the hymns. Information about the musical pieces, such as title, composer, and arranger are listed, along with, perhaps, some background on the anthem piece and lyrics. The bulletin is put together by Scott and Julie through scanning and preparation of a PDF and conversion to images for the purpose of the email blast to the congregation.
- 5) Prior to the actual livestreaming, there is a run-through to check the audio levels on playback, identify the camera settings, and walk through the parts of the service. Scott plays the music files from his laptop. It looks like this:



6) The livestreaming worship service begins with a 5-minute warning (and reminder to turn off outlook), a 3-minute warning (and reminder to set the sound level), a 2-minute warning (and reminder to turn on the lapel microphone), a 1-minute warning (and reminder to turn on the lapel microphone) and go live

Helping the Community

Request for Assistance with NHCC Food Pantry and NHHS Student Welfare Fund was received with resounding support. At the end of March, Adam Schweickert requested contributions to two important programs in our Community.

First is the food pantry housed at our church that provides food to families in town. John Tibor, Nancy Mahoney, Julie, and Todd are hard at work each week organizing and running the Food Pantry as demand continues to grow. Julie is working with Keith Tarr, Manager of Stop & Shop (North Haven), to provide shopping lists for needed items at least 1-2 times per week. Keith's staff completes the shopping for the Food Pantry during restocking hours, and Wendy Glynn has been a terrific help in paying for, pickingup, and delivering that food to the Church.

The second is the student welfare fund, a program identified by Dr. Russ Dallai, Principal of North Haven High School. Dr. Dallai mentioned that the "Student Welfare Fund" is running low compared to previous years, due to its funding sources drying up. The Fund is administered by him and 1-school social worker, working together, and the funds are distributed to students in need on school-related items. For example, they use the fund to assist students who cannot afford a yearbook (he thinks they cost approximately \$90 each).

Historically, they have used things like book fines and replacement fees to support the Fund, which – without the students present in school – means that there are currently no contributions to the Fund, and a low likelihood of incoming-money this Spring.

As of today, Men's Fellowship has raised <u>\$1,790.00</u> for the Food Pantry and <u>\$500.00 for the North Haven</u> <u>High School Student Welfare Fund</u>.
