The first lesson this morning is based upon John 11:1-45.

Jesus Visits His Friends

Jesus' friend Lazarus lived in a small town called Bethany with his two sisters, Mary and Martha. Lazarus became very sick and he died. His sisters were so sad. They cried as they wrapped his body in cloth and buried him in a cave. (Wrap one of the figures in cloth strips, place inside a cup lying on its side, and place the cardboard circle in front of the opening.)

Soon after that Jesus went to Bethany. When he arrived, Jesus heard that Lazarus had been dead for four days. Everyone was very sad. Martha came out to meet Jesus. (Place the figure representing Jesus next to the one representing Martha.)

"Oh, Jesus," she said, "if only you had been here, Lazarus wouldn't have died.

""Martha, your brother will live again," Jesus replied gently. "I can bring new life, just as God brings new life. Can you believe that?"

"Yes," said Martha, "I do believe." She went back into the house to call Mary, her sister. Mary came out of the house to see Jesus. She was crying, too. (Place the figure representing Mary next to Martha and Jesus.) Jesus asked to see where Lazarus was buried. So Mary and Martha showed him the cave where they had put Lazarus's body. There was a big stone across the entrance. A group of people gathered around the tomb with them. They were all very sad. (Place the figures of Jesus, Mary, Martha, and the crowd next to the tomb.)

Jesus cried. He was sad that Lazarus was dead. "Open up this tomb," said Jesus. "Take the stone away from the entrance."

"We shouldn't do that," said Martha. "He has been dead for four days. His body will smell."

But they did as Jesus asked and took away the stone. (Take the stone away.)

Jesus knew that God was with him in this sad time, and prayed, "Please, God, hear me." Then Jesus called in a loud voice, "Lazarus, come out!"

Suddenly everyone gasped. A figure hobbled out of the cave (move the figure of Lazarus out of the tomb). It was wrapped up in white cloth from head to toe, and could hardly move. Was it a ghost?

"Unwrap those grave clothes," said Jesus. "Let Lazarus go free."

Mary and Martha unwound the grave clothes (unwrap the figure of Lazarus); they could hardly believe their eyes. It was Lazarus...and he was alive!

What a celebration there was in Bethany that day! Everyone had to tell the story over and over again. Nobody would ever forget what had happened.

The Second lesson this morning is taken from the book of Ezekial starting at the 7^{th} chapter beginning at the 1^{st} verse.

The word of the LORD came to me: You, O mortal, thus says the Lord GOD to the land of Israel:

None of them shall remain, not their abundance, not their wealth; no pre-eminence among them.

The time has come, the day draws near; let not the buyer rejoice, nor the seller mourn,

for wrath is upon all their multitude.


