Yet whatever gains I had, these I have come to regard as loss because of Christ. More than that, I regard everything as loss because of the surpassing value of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord. For his sake I have suffered the loss of all things, and I regard them as rubbish, in order that I may gain Christ and be found in him, not having a righteousness of my own that comes from the law, but one that comes through faith in Christ, the righteousness from God based on faith. THE SECOND SCRIPTURE LESSON: John 12:1-8 Page 1250 Six days before the Passover Jesus came to Bethany, the home of Lazarus, whom he had raised from the dead. There they gave a dinner for him. Martha served, and Lazarus was one of those at the table with him. Mary took a pound of costly perfume made of pure nard, anointed Jesus' feet, and wiped them with her hair. The house was filled with the fragrance of the perfume. But Judas Iscariot, one of his disciples (the one who was about to betray him), said, "Why was this perfume not sold for three hundred denarii and the money given to the poor?" (He said this not because he cared about the poor, but because he was a thief; he kept the common purse and used to steal what was put into it.) Jesus said, "Leave her alone. The following items in good condition do well in an on-line auction: tools, working power tools, jewelry, watches, antique clocks, outside patio furniture, lawn decorations, working lawn mower, home decor, crystal, china sets, 78s with colorful covers, music albums, particularly The Beatles, "mid-century modern" items, old corning ware with designs, dish sets, bar ware, fancy mirror, china tea cups and saucers, unique and funky items, kayaks, old signs, old comic books, antique toys, games in original boxes that are complete and in good condition, unused new kitchen equipment gifts you may have received, Kitchen Aid mixer, anything name brand, Hummel, Lladro, Dooney&Bourke, Coach, Tiffany, Waterford, Limoge, small furniture items, occasional tables, small bureau or bookcase, chairs, art glass items, sterling items, gold items, bicycle, kayaks, high quality rugs, Karastan, fishing poles, interesting bookends or door stops, foreign currency, old U.S. coins, leather coat in good condition, fur coat, even if needing repair. 


