Last year, Easter fell on the fourth Sunday of online worship after the pandemic shutdown in mid-March. Some of us had hoped, initially, that the shut-down would end before Easter. The reality of online worship only, and no in-person worship, on EASTER was startling. It takes some extra thinking to figure out what Easter even means without being together in-person.



This year Easter has a different feeling. Sadly, we are more accustomed to not worshiping together in the sanctuary. Julie, Gary, Jeff, and Karlee have worked with dedication to prepare and maintain our online worship. Mark Bessette and a whole group of Deacons – Jim and Joan Bennett, Sally Pallatto, Cathy Welch, Nancy Mahoney, Carol Amico, and Sue Compton – have assisted with online worship and with receiving, forwarding, and responding to text messages of the names of Sunday worshipers. And yet ... online worship is for most of us a substitute for the in-person worship we cherish and yearn for.

We had three in-person worship services back in the fall, and then stopped and shifted to online worship only as COVID case levels rose. We will worship together in-person again. Once COVID case levels have declined sufficiently we will resume in-person worship.



We will need to pre-register, sit safely distanced, wear masks and refrain from singing, and we will worship together in-person.

We are "in the between time" now. Our Lenten journey of prayer, repentance and reconciliation is weighted with the strain of separation. God is with us, though, in our yearning and our hoping. We have learned that we can celebrate together, alone in our various places. We will continue to worship and celebrate together, alone, because we can and it gives us comfort and hope. And we say, "Next Easter in the sanctuary!"

Church School - Spring 2021




Church school continues using the WHIRL lectionary curriculum which offers many options for in-person and/or digital learning. The printed, lectionary-based resources originally intended for in-person learning are modified on a weekly basis to meet the needs of digital or virtual learning for the children and their families to utilize at home.

On the first and third Sundays of each month, each family is sent via email, one lectionary-based scripture. Accompanying the scripture, is the day's theme or focus, an opening and/or closing prayer, suggestions for getting a discussion going, and suggestion(s) for a family activity to enhance the day's biblical scripture and lesson.

On March 21st Jeff and Karlee co-hosted a special Church School Zoom Sing-Along. The children enjoyed conversation and singing with Jeff. He selected two songs, both familiar from past years and invited the children to join him in singing. They all seemed to enjoy the opportunity to sing and are looking forward to at least one more Sing-Along on April 18. We may also schedule another day for singing on May 16.

On the second and fourth Sundays of each month, I host a Zoom gathering for the children at 11:00 or 12:00, depending on their ages/grades. During our 30-40 minutes together, we catch up with one another, recall the day's scripture read during worship, recall what church season we're celebrating, and then participate in a re-reading of the selected scripture. I also share an age-appropriate video based upon the day's biblical scripture and theme. The video provides a connection of the biblical scripture to daily life. Nearly every Zoom Sunday, I have had the usual attendance we expect with In-person worship and church school.



churches in town. The pantry is open to any resident in North Haven that asks for

Wednesday, and Friday between 10:00am and 11:00am by appointment. People are

eligible to come once every 30 days to pick up 2 bags of non-perishable food.

In addition to monthly food, the churches in town distribute "Holiday Food Boxes" for Thanksgiving and Christmas. These "boxes" include a Turkey, fresh fruits and

vegetables, dairy and all the makings for a holiday meal. We give out over 100 boxes

food. We distribute food Monday,

I am proud to tell you that the Food Pantry has been open and providing support to the community throughout the "Closing". We have been able to provide food to North Haven Residents in need by never closing the doors to the food pantry. We have had terrific support from the congregation and the community. The Food Pantry Mission Team has changed their procedures to create a safe environment and still be able to support those in need. John Tibor and Nancy Mahoney come to the church Monday,

Wednesday, and Friday from 10-11 to make up bags and give out food. Darlene & Katie Rogers, and Wendy Glynn pick up food from Stop & Shop on Saturday mornings, when needed. Gail Fulop stocks and organizes the pantry with the food donations we receive.

In order to give people additional ways to sign up for food, we have added a signup page on our website. This allows clients to request a food pickup time when it is convenient for them.


In-Person Worship Update

In-Person Worship remains suspended in response to a high level of COVID+ cases. Online Worship is still continuing each Sunday morning. The number of hospitalizations and the positivity rate has fallen. This is good news and a hopeful development! The ReOpening Team reviews the CT COVID information weekly to determine when the rate of COVID cases and hospitalizations indicate the possibility of resuming In-Person Worship. The CT Department of Public Health developed a COVID Response Framework based on the number of positive cases in the town. Their recommendation is to

postpone indoor activities at case levels of 15/100,000 or higher. The State of CT provides a color-coded map of towns in the state based on the average daily rate of COVID19 cases among persons living in community settings. Towns with cases levels of 15/100,000 or higher are shown in red. Towns with case levels below 15/100,000 are shown in orange, yellow or gray. The ReOpening Team has determined that the case level in North Haven and surround towns needs to be below 15 per 100,000 for two weeks before In-Person Worship indoors can be considered. From January 23—February 21 the case level in North Haven declined from 71.2 to 23.8. Since February 21 cases have risen to 32.3. Any decision to resume In-Person Worship will be shared promptly with church leadership and the congregation. Who was Mr. William H Todd?

"Mr. William H. Todd known as "Will" to many and "Mr. Church" to others, carried a great deal of weight both in body, and affairs of the Church. Through the areas of many ministers he was chairman of the Prudential (finance) committee, Chairman of the Trustees and Financial Agent, as well as sexton. He kept the coal furnace stoked, carried out the ashes, made minor repairs, did all the cleaning, as well as being in charge of leasing the horse sheds. He was the person whose permission was sought to use the Church for weddings, funerals, fairs, suppers, etc but never for dancing or card playing. In the fire of 1941 he salvaged some of the stained glass windows and part, of the pipe organ which he sent to the manufacturer to be repaired and reused in our present organ.

He lived by the pond of his name all his life, having dammed Bog Mine Brook himself to form the pond for his water fowl.

He raised asparagus and strawberries for sale (one could earn 2 cents a quart picking his berries) and was noted for his Peruvian daffodils.

Each season he took orders for Shad from friends and neighbors and went to the Connecticut River to make the purchases to fill the orders.

After the death of his wife Cora he lived alone for many years until he married Emma Shaffer, late in his life. Being childless he devoted most of his time and energy and love to the Church. All of what is now the Plymouth Park development once belonged to him. The first buyer failed in his payments and Mr. Todd foreclosed and took all the land back. However, the success of a subsequent business deal entitled him to a comfortable life upon his retirement. The residue of his estate in the amount of \$27,000, for the Church is accepted with warm regard. (Joseph Chapman, Donald and Priscilla Bassett)"

We received a call in the Church Office asking if we would accept a donation of desk lamps from MaxLite. We said "Yes" and two days later a palate of boxes were delivered. Inside each box were about 20 UI Gift Bags. Each reusable shopping bag had a "smart" powerstrip/surge protector, a LED desk lamp (white or black) and

paperwork talking about energy savings.

We have been giving these bags out to our food pantry clients and members of the



church that have been at the church working. If anyone would like a "UI gift bag" please stop by the church during office hours and we will provide one to you.

Building and Grounds Monthly Update

This past month Building and Grounds has worked on the following projects:

- 1) We had the annual maintenance of both boilers and learned there are maintenance items on the boilers we can do ourselves to save money. Paul and I performed them this year. We also cleared out both rooms that were being used for storage. That is both a fire hazard and against fire regulations.
- 2) The new phone system is up and running! The

phone system in the church has now been upgraded to a new digital Panasonic system that will allow for more flexibility. We are able to change any greeting based on holiday closings, weather conditions, and general announcements. It also gives us the ability to email audio files of



messages left on the phone. Now we can hear messages from anywhere in real time. We also can upload music files for our hold music. We currently have a beautiful piece played by Josh Peiffer on flute. We will update the hold music periodically.



We've also decided that we needed a phone down in the hallway near the food pantry. Mark Bessette made a custom box to go in the wall in order to recess the phone nearby for the pantry.

3) The fire alarm system needed to be updated. The main panel has been replaced and new wiring added where needed.





We had a majority of heat sensors in the church that need to be changed out to both heat and smoke sensors. Something

we never had were sensors in the attic's. Paul Powers and I are running the cables and will install heat sensors that will be tied into the alarm panel. Once all that work is completed we will contact the fire department for our annual inspection.

4) We also put a handle on the steps of the "Stage Area". This space is now being used by the women's fellowship as a storage room. They have graciously giving up "Room 5" to allow the Food Pantry to use that space. Hopefully next month we will have a picture of the new "Room 5: Food Pantry Annex".
