The United Church of Christ has issued an Emergency Appeal for Aid to Ukraine. The UCC, through Global Ministries, will collaborate with ACT Alliance and the Reformed Church of Hungary to bring aid to Ukraine. Hungarian Reformed Church Aid has been offering humanitarian assistance since the beginning of the Russian attack on Ukraine on Feb. 24. They have been working with refugees who are leaving Ukraine, and with elderly and other vulnerable communities who have not been able to leave, including immigrants and migrant groups who are experiencing difficulties crossing into other European countries. A special worship service is in the planning stages for the fall. Our usual worship service will be dedicated to children – children in our communities and the orphaned children of the world. The Holy Spirit has worked through a small group of us to conceive of and offer to you this special worship service.

We invite you to attend worship and to deeply internalize the vast disparity in the lives of children on this earth. Bring your children, grandchildren, nieces and nephews and help them learn to love and care for those less fortunate than themselves.

The best gift we can give our children is the ability to be grateful – to thank God for all they are and for all they have been given. They need to know that they are cherished and loved by God their father, who will always be with them.

One way to teach our children gratitude is to help them understand that there are children in our world who do not have the same things they enjoy. Let us join together, as one strong Body of Christ, to live as Jesus taught us. Let us show our children an example of true love and compassion. Let us teach our children gratitude. These are the best gifts we can give our children.

May the Holy Spirit work through you to answer this call.
