



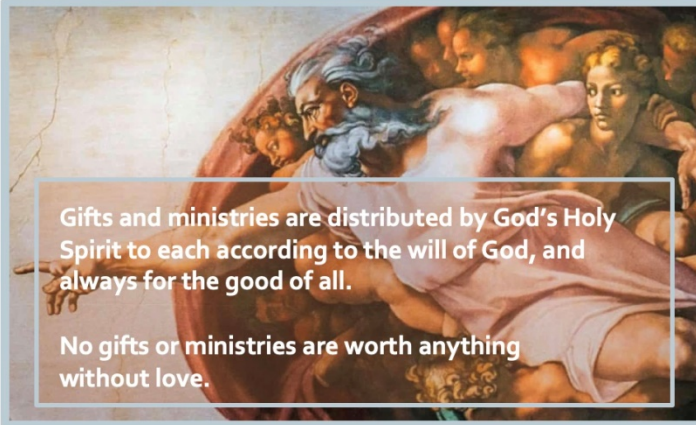

FROM THE PASTOR 

Gifts and Abilities

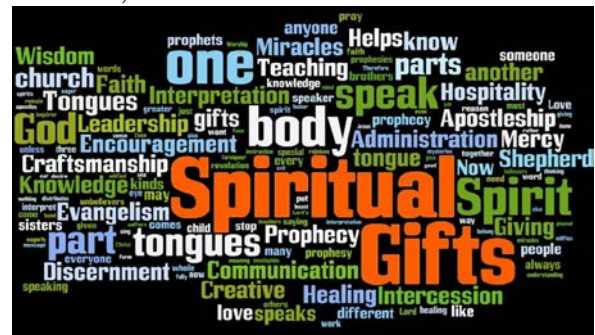


The 12th chapter of Paul's first letter to the Corinthians offers an inspirational challenge to that congregation, and to ours. The first section talks about spiritual gifts. Paul points out that "there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; and there are varieties of services, but the same Lord; and there are varieties of activities, but it is the same God who activates all of them in everyone." (v.4-6) God is the giver, the coordinator, the leader. Paul notes that everyone is gifted by God. "To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good." (v.7) Paul describes the blessing, the wealth of resources of the congregation in the gifts with which God has endowed each member. Paul offers a list of gifts, mentioning wisdom and knowledge, faith and healing power and prophecy. We might add some of the gifts we observe and cherish among the congregation: singing, painting, cooking, storytelling, setting up and fixing computers, building websites, listening, reading the Bible in worship, and visiting. All of these gifts are empowered by God, and can be put to work to serve God.

The second part of chapter 12 talks about the diversity of abilities among the congregation. Paul begins by emphasizing that all are welcome and all belong. "For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ. For in the one Spirit we were all baptized into one body—Jews or Greeks, slaves or free—and we were all made to drink of one Spirit." (v. 12-13) Paul explains that the congregation has many diverse members just as our bodies have different members, or parts. Just as our bodies need hands and feet, a nose and ears, so the congregation needs the abilities of all the members. Paul notes that among the congregation there may be apostles, prophets, and teachers, healers and helpers and leaders. Paul insists "Now you are the body of Christ and individually members of it." (v. 27) We are all, each one of us, part of the body of Christ.

This teaching commands our broad and enthusiastic welcome – encouraging all who would join in the mission of the church – and noticing and empowering their gifts. This teaching also calls us to prayerful reflection about our own spiritual gifts and how they might serve God through the ministry of the Church. These are essential spiritual tasks as we prepare to come back together as congregation and a church.

Last week, I made a snow angel. I can't remember the last time I made one. As a child or when Kristen and Erin were growing up, I made them often. Did we have more snow then? It sure seems that way. Being out in the crisp air was invigorating. Looking up at the beautiful blue sky was serene. God provides amazing things for us to experience. We have so much to be grateful for.

When I think about family and friends watching over me, I especially think about Grandma Fowler. She is one of my special angels. My sister and I often spent Saturday night at Grandma and Grandpa Fowler's house. My parents would pick us up the next morning and drive us all to church. Grandpa was legally blind by then and Grandma never learned to drive. We belonged to Mt. Carmel Congregational Church.

One Sunday, Grandma announced she was not going to church. When I asked her why, she replied that her hair didn't look right. I told her that God didn't care what her hair looked like. Guess who decided to go church after all!

As a child, I am ashamed to admit, I would bite my nails. Grandma tried all sorts of things to get me to stop. She bought me gelatin to strengthen my nails, a blue scarf and 2 small butterfly pins. I don't remember if anything persuaded me to stop or I just stopped on my own.

Grandma had a special bond with Kristen also. They would often play "school" together. Kristen was the teacher and Gram was the student. Years later, when Kristen was to be married, I prayed that Sept. 24th would be a beautiful day. The week leading up to the wedding, I began seeing butterflies. A butterfly flew by the kitchen window and I saw one on the playground at school. One afternoon, I stopped by my parents. Mom wanted to give Kristen something that belonged to her. She showed me 2 platters. One had butterflies! Grandma Fowler was telling me not to worry. She had this covered! Kristen and Brian were married on a beautiful, warm, autumn day. The day after the wedding, Ken and I drove to the cemetery. I wanted to place flowers on my grandparents' headstone. A butterfly flew by the car window on our way there.

I know for certain my Grandma sent the butterflies. It was her way of telling me she was watching over us along with my other grandparents. As you can imagine, I think of her when I see a butterfly. What angels watch over you? Do they send you signs like my grandma does? I hope so. I hope you find comfort in knowing you have special angels too.

Some families have informed Karlee that their children will not be participating in Church School Zoom but will return to NHCC once in-person worship has resumed. We hope by mid-February, we can all return

to in-person worship and/or Church school. Should in-person worship and church school remain suspended through March, families will be updated and the current Zoom schedule will remain in effect.

Zoom Church school lessons each week focus on the UCC Common Lectionary and include scripture and/or a Bible story, an activity related to or from the Children's accompanying leaflets for each lesson, discussion and/or fun video to reinforce the day's theme.

In-Person Worship Update

In-Person Worship remains suspended in response to the high level COVID+ cases, hospitalizations, and positivity-rate of testing. Online Worship is still continuing each Sunday morning. Most recently, the number of hospitalizations and cases has begun to decline, though the number of deaths has increased slightly. The ReOpening Team will review the CT COVID information to determine when the rate of COVID cases and hospitalizations indicate the possibility of resuming In-Person Worship. Any decision to resume In-Person Worship will be shared promptly with church leadership and the congregation.

Gary Snowbeck to Retire

Gary Snowbeck, Church Organist, has announced he will retire at the end of June 2022. Gary will stay through the remainder of the academic year, and his final Sunday will be June 26. He will complete 11 years as Organist at NHCC in June, and Gary served previously as Organist and Choir Director. Gary's music is soothing and uplifting, setting the tone for our worship with great sensitivity. His tremendous talent and great dedication have served our congregation very generously. His willingness and flexibility in recording music at home for use in livestream broadcast during the pandemic shutdown has been a remarkable contribution to our worship.

Gary writes "It has been a privilege to serve the people of the North Haven Congregational Church these many years. May God bless all of you and guide you in your search for a new organist."

The Ministry Leadership Board and the Music Mission Team will work to form a search committee and begin the search process for a successor. We look forward to a celebration of Gary's service in the spring.

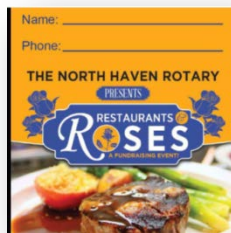
Weekly Bible Study on Tuesday – Join Us!

The Conference also has a new texting service. Anyone wishing to receive occasional updates from the Conference via text can text the word GROW to 855-840-1952.

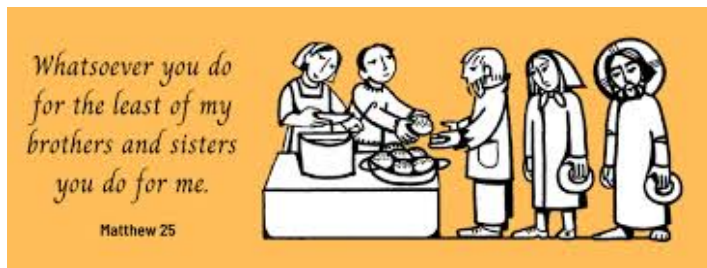

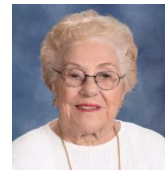

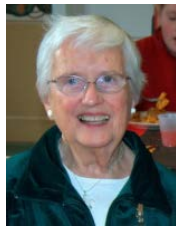
