Coming Back

We have just held our first in-person worship service since last October! It was a delight to see church members in the pews amid the bright decorations for Pentecost, and listen to Gary Snowbeck play the organ! I feel great joy and deep gratitude to God that our community has reached a low level of COVID cases and a high level of vaccination that allow us to gather together inside safely. We will continue to schedule in-person worship services as we gradually resume indoor activities and programs at church. We will also continue to livestream our worship service online. The pandemic shutdown with precautions and restrictions has been strenuous for almost everyone. Differences of opinion, conflicting advice, and political maneuvering have caused confusion and stress.

Coming back will be an exciting and gratifying process!

Are you ready for another "new" normal? The last 14 months have overused the term and now

with Connecticut leading the way in vaccinations, we are about to embark on some "new normals." Our family finally had a chance to have four generations together on Mother's Day. While it was not the entire family, it was a long-awaited chance for 92-year old "G.G." (Great grandma) to hug a few of her children, grandkids and great grandchildren. The vaccinations have made this possible with a reasonable sense of security. The future is looking brighter with news that we should be resuming in-church worship services very soon (possibly while you are reading this). Having regular get-togethers with family and friends, picnics, fairs and church service feel possible. A night out with your favorite person is so long overdue. We are a resilient people, but this is something we have never endured before and pray that we will not have to ever endure again.

We are starting to be comfortable getting together with family and friends that we know have the same safety values that helped us survive this pandemic and we encourage everyone to do the same. Be diligent. We still need to be cautious. Remember that everyone is entitled to their own beliefs, even though they may not be the same as our own, you need to feel comfortable with the people around you.

Church School - Late Spring 2021

Although NHCC has resumed In-Person worship on specific Sundays, the Church school will continue with Zoom Church School on the second and fourth Sundays of the month. We continue using the WHIRL lectionary curriculum through June 27; which is modified for use for digital learning. As for Summer Church School, that will be determined and families will be notified if and when there is Summer Church School.

The dates for Church School Zoom meetings are June 6 and 13. Zoom gatherings for the younger (PreK to Grade 2) will occur at 11:00-11:30 am. The older children (Grade 3-7) are scheduled for 12:00-12:30 pm. During our 30-40 minutes together, we catch up with one another, recall the day's scripture read during worship, recall what church season we're celebrating, and then participate in a re-reading of the selected scripture. I also share an age-appropriate video based upon the day's biblical scripture and theme. The video provides a connection of the biblical scripture to daily life. Nearly every Zoom Sunday, I have had the usual attendance we expect with In-person worship and church school.

Potential Plans for Fall 2021

As of May 19, I anticipate and look forward to resuming In-person Church School in the Fall,

assuming we continue with in-Person worship at that point. If we continue with In-Person worship, Rally Day will be September 12. On that day, we will have a special event after church (TBD). Additionally, the Church School rooms will be modified to maintain Social Distancing for the children during church school. Likewise, each child will have his or her box of pencils, crayons, scissors, etc. If you have any concerns or questions, please send me an email and I will do my best to answer your question(s) and address your concerns.

In-Person Worship Resumes!

There is good news to share! As of 5/13, COVID-19 case levels in North Haven have fallen to **10.6** per 100,000. Case levels have fallen consistently in April from a recent high of 39.5.

In-Person Worship resumed on May 23! In-Person worship will be scheduled twice per month for now – May 30, June 13, June 27 Online Worship is still continuing each Sunday morning.

The following precautions are in place for In-Person Worship:

- Attendees must pre-register
- Attendees can choose between socially distanced pews (household groups maintain 6-foot distance) and open pews (vaccinated people can opt to sit together)
- Attendees must wear masks and refrain from singing, eating, drinking
- Windows will be open, fans blowing outward only
- Upper level bathrooms will be open
- Sanctuary will be open beginning at 9:10a.m.

Pre-registration for In-Person Worship can be done through the Church website – northhavenucc.org. Click on **Worship Services** at the top of the page; drop down to **In-Person Worship Registration.** If you need assistance or have questions, please call the Church Office.

Worship Services Online

Worship services are being live streamed to the NHCC website (<u>www.northhavenucc.org</u>) on Sunday mornings at 9:30am. The services can be watched on a desktop or laptop computer, a tablet or iPad, or a smartphone. We update the congregation on worship details weekly by email. More recently, the services have been recorded. Recordings can also be viewed through the church website. If you **are not able to watch** the service online for any reason, please call the church office and let us know. Worship services are now broadcast on NHTV, the North Haven public access cable channel, on the Wednesday, Saturday, and Sunday following the Sunday of the service, at 6pm.

The Church has Re-Opened:

North Haven Congregational Church has reopened for in person worship. If you would like to attend a Sunday Service you can request a pew on our website.

NHCC's new policy will allow family groups and individuals to request socially distant seating as well as the opportunity to request normal seating (nonsocially distant) for those fully vaccinated.

Results of the <u>Second</u> Return to In-Person Worship Survey

The ReOpening Team would like to thank everyone who participated through the second online Return to In-Person Worship Survey in April, and share some of the results. The survey was completed in April of this year. There were 77 responses representing 142 individuals across households. Among the responses 63% said they attend always or almost always, and 25% reported they attend often. Perhaps most striking is that **91% of respondents reported being fully vaccinated**.

The online livestream worship service received a similarly high rate of satisfaction as in the previous survey. The level of interest in attending in-person worship with the same precautions used last year is moderate to low: 19% indicated their interest was a lout of 10; 16% indicated a level of interest as 10 out of 10. About 1/3 of respondents expressed interest in

outdoor worship services (outside of Sunday morning) and other outdoor social activities, and just under half were interested in socially distanced picnics or gatherings.

Comparison of first and second survey results: There was slightly less representation from households with children in the second survey. There was slightly less satisfaction with the online streaming service, and slightly increased interest in attending in-person worship.

Comments: The comments included appreciation for the recording of the online service. There were similar desire to return and frustration with being online from some. There were increased observations of service not starting on time, and increase emphasis on music. The comments reflect a push and pull between a readiness to come back, concern for safety, and ambivalence about necessary safety precautions (understand why precautions are there but not wanting to return until precautions are lifted and things are as they were). Music and singing are central to many person's responses. Compared with the previous survey, there are similar rates of people not wanting to be told what to do.

The complete survey results will be posted in the church and made available for members to read in full. The ReOpening Team and the Ministry Leadership Board approved a prompt return to inperson worship in response to the strong interest indicated in the survey. The ReOpening Team will continue to respond to survey in planning for increased in-person worship and programming in accordance with evidence-based guidelines from the CDC, the State of CT, and the Quinnipiack Valley Health District.

This past month Building and Grounds has worked on the following projects:

1) Annual Fire Inspection completed with North Haven Fire Department. Mark Bessette worked with the NHFD to ensure our building is in compliance with all safety measures. Mark will be following up by testing all emergency lighting and exit signs to ensure all batteries are ready for an emergency.

- 2) Cut and removed tree from church lawn. Mark Bessette and Paul Powers took care of the Dogwood tree that came down in a recent storm. They cut it up into manageable pieces and hauled it away.
- 3) Re-modeled "Room 5" is now the Food Pantry Annex. The Annex is used to store over-flow food for the Food Pantry. As new food comes in to the church it is sorted by use by/experation date. The food with the dates furthest out will be stored in the Annex and used to restock the Food Pantry as needed.

<u>Men's Fellowship</u>

The men's group held two Zoom Meetings since the last Window deadline. The first one, on May 1st, had five men participating, while our May 15th virtual gathering attracted six. Participating in one or both get-togethers were Jim Bennett, Gary Czajkowski, Joe DeLuca, Rev. Scott Morrow, Bryant Munson, Tim Peiffer, Stephen Simonson, and John Tibor. Pandemic-related news was again a primary focus of our discussions but in a much more positive way, as we learned that North Haven was recently removed from Red status, as the number of cases dropped to just 10.6/100,000 in the most recent two-week reporting period, well below the less than 15/100,000 threshold. Consequently, the church will cautiously return to in-person worship, with precautions, beginning May 23rd, on a twice-a-month basis. (I'm sure everyone can find additional information on the in-person worship guidelines elsewhere in this newsletter.)

Interestingly, Scott informed us that of the seventyseven people (representing 146 congregants) who responded to the most recent Church Re-opening Survey, 91% reported that they were fully vaccinated.

We also learned that there has been very little sentiment expressed in favor of participating in this year's Memorial Day Parade.

We held a brief dialogue regarding conducting a possible men's-sponsored social/fundraiser this coming summer, so please stay tuned as further details of it are revealed in the coming months.

Other news passed along: Scott noted that he will be performing his first baptism in more than fourteen months on May 23rd; John T. mentioned that granddaughter Viviana will be participating in a multi-generational play being presented at the North Haven Fairgrounds on July 9th-11th; Tim P. announced that Joshua will be matriculating at the Cleveland Institute of Music starting August 15th.
