NHCC continues to be in-person and mask-optional.

Our worship services are in-person every week, and wearing a mask is optional. Online worship continues each Sunday as well. We ask everyone attending worship in-person to please wear a nametag. The nametags will help us exchange personal greeting and engage in conversation. Anyone desiring safely-distanced seating in worship should speak with the Greeters.

The mask-optional policy opens the possibility of eating and drinking in the church building. Coffee Hours will resume and we encourage you to volunteer to host a Coffee Hour. Sign up on the Church website or call the Church Office with questions.

Anyone with a recent COVID diagnosis or who is not feeling well should not come into the building.

The ReOpening Team continues to follow the COVID case levels in our community. Case levels are up in North Haven and surrounding towns; the average as of 4/21 is 29.3 cases\ per 100,000. Church Building Open for In-Person Mask-Optional Gatherings

Church groups and community groups can meet in the church in-person and wearing a mask is optional. Eating and drinking are permitted. Safe distanced seating (6-feet apart) should be available for those who request it, and meetings should be restricted to two and a half hours.

As weather permits, windows should be open.

Anyone with a recent COVID diagnosis or who is not feeling well should not come into the building.

Music Mission Team:

We had a delightful Sunday on May 22 when we were treated to some amazing music! Our prelude was



offered by Joshua Peiffer, who is now a highly accomplished musician and man with many talents. On the flute, he played the stunning Allemande movement from Partita in A Minor by Johann Sebastian Bach.

After singing the opening hymn, we offered a choral introit found in the Presbyterian hymnals and

the Methodist Hymnal, but not Voices United or New Century. It is a West Indian melody arranged to fit the Lord's Prayer, with a lively call and response feel. Joshua used his well-developed and strong baritone voice to deliver to the opening lines, "Our Father, Which Art In Heaven" (The KJV words to the prayer).



Members of the children's choir joined members of the chancel choir to provide the meditative and repetitive reminder, "hallowed be Thy name" in this fast moving and free-rhythm chant.

Due to the rather extreme heat and humidity of the day, the adult choir chose to stay out of choir robes, but it was still wonderful to see the small but mighty group back in the chancel, along with the very musical children's choir!

The Chancel Choir would then lead us in yet another rendition of the Lord's Prayer, this one a four part setting with very luscious harmonies. Such an important text stands alone as an anthem and the adults did a fabulous job making music with it.

After singing the closing hymn, "All Things Bright and Beautiful", masterly accompanied by Gary Snowbeck, we were treated to a curiously titled postlude "You Shall Go Out With Joy!" by Douglas Wagner, which did not disappoint! It brought much joy! Gary's astute musical sensitivity and consummate church-music professionalism will be GREATLY missed upon his retirement at the end of next month.

Adding to the special feelings of today, it was noted by many of us that a very special "choir couple", John and Linda Rankin, are celebrating their anniversary! Happy Anniversary to John and Linda Rankin!

After so much preparation by Karlee Etter and Faith Formation teachers and team members to write and compile this service, it was great to have music which supported the mission and ministry of this memorable Sunday at NHCC.

Assistance for Guilford Hostage

In April a woman was held hostage in her home by a family member who suffered a psychotic break. This incident ended with the woman rescued safely, and the death by suicide of the relative who took her hostage. This family is had a close relationship with both UCC churches in Guilford. In the aftermath of this situation, there is a need for trauma counseling, medical bills, aftermath cleaning and decontamination of the the home, as well as repair and replacement of furniture and household items damaged or destroyed. These costs go beyond what insurance will cover. The Southern New England Conference and the New Haven East Consociation have made emergeny grants to this individual. We are appealing to church members to consider making a donation to these recovery costs. 
