In-Person Worship Resumes!

In-Person Worship has resumed every Sunday! COVID case levels locally and state-wide have decreased consistently for several weeks, as have hospitalizations and the positivity rate. As of mid-February, case levels in North Haven and the surrounding communities have fallen to the same levels we had in mid-December, and we were able to safely resume in-person activities.

There will be In-Person Worship every Sunday. Online Worship is still continuing each Sunday morning as well.

The following precautions are in place for In-Person Worship:

- Attendees must sign in as they arrive.
- Attendees can choose between safe distanced seating (6-feet between different household groups) and open seating (fully vaccinated/boosted people can opt to sit together.)
- Attendees must wear masks.
- Please do not come into the building if you have been recently diagnosed with COVID or are not feeling well.
- Food and drink are not permitted, with the exception of pre-packaged communion elements.
- With warmer weather, windows will be open.
- Beginning March 6, Carroll Hall will be open after worship for "non-coffee" social hour to allow for visiting and socializing

Church groups and community groups may once again meet in the Church building with the following precautions:

- Please do not come into the building if you have been recently diagnosed with COVID or are not feeling well.
- Meetings should be restricted to two and a half hours.
- With warmer weather, windows should be open.

Abraham's Tent - Columbus House

The program we supported for ten years known as Abraham's Tent is not able to exist as we know it. However, Columbus House, the sponsoring agency, continues to serve people who are homeless or at risk of becoming homeless by providing shelter and housing and by fostering their personal growth and independence.

There are many expenses when setting up an apartment. The staff at Columbus House has developed a program to supply Welcome Kits to make this transition easier and show how much others care. They are Cleaning (\$30), Bathroom (\$50), Kitchen (\$100), and Bedroom (\$120).

The need to support the homelessness is still great. Last year we donated \$1720. That means 14 clients received a warm blanket in their bedroom kit. How many kits can we provide this year?

Please send your check payable to NHCC, indicate it is for Columbus House by March 15. We will pass it on.

Contributions To The Pastoral Discretionary Fund

The Pastoral Discretionary Fund is a small fund which is available for Pastor Scott to use confidentially in responding to requests for pastoral assistance. The fund has been used to provide emergency oil deliveries, for limited assistance with utility bills, for the purchase of gasoline, and, very occasionally, for overnight accommodation at a hotel. These requests come from both church members and people in the community. The money for the Pastor's Discretionary Fund has customarily come from the surplus amount collected for poinsettias at Christmas. This source has not been available during the last two years. The One Great Hour of Sharing, which is part of Our Church's Wider Mission, is the special mission offering of the United Church of Christ provides for people in crisis throughout the world. The UCC works with other churches and international partners to sources of clean water, food, education and health care, small business micro-credit, advocacy and resettlement for refugees and displaced persons, and emergency relief and rehabilitation. One Great Hour of Sharing also supports domestic and international ministries for disaster preparedness and response. The Christian denominations and agencies supporting One Great Hour of Sharing include the American Baptist Church, Christian Church (Disciples of Christ), Church of the Brethren, the United Church of Christ, and Church World Service. The UCC offering supports 2 One Great Hour of Sharing missionaries and 1 Global Mission Intern working in disaster relief, health care, education, sustainable agricultural development, and refugee support. On average, of every dollar given to One Great Hour of Sharing, 95 cents is used directly for mission programming; and 5 cents for interpretation materials. Please give generously on March 27!
