#### In the Wilderness

Are we there yet? That was the most common question on the long car trips with my family - followed closely by wanting a drink of water or needing a bathroom. Miles and miles and hours and hours with my brother and sister and I filling the back seat and bothering each other. Are we there yet?

The pandemic has been a little like a long car trip! It started very suddenly and was really scary. Then everything either shut down or got disrupted. Then it seemed to get better and ended up even worse. Now the vaccines are here and spring is here. *Are we there yet?* 

The closure of the church and the shutdown of inperson worship has been a terrible ordeal. Giving up gathered worship with singing, sitting with friends, passing the communion tray or sharing a greeting of peace - giving that up has been difficult and painful. Are we there yet?

It makes me think of the stories of the Israelites wandering in the wilderness after escaping from slavery in Egypt. A journey that took far longer than anyone imagined it might. A harsh journey without enough food to eat, without enough water to drink. A journey toward a promised land that seemed to always be a long way off.



We're not there yet. Opening for in-person worship is coming, but it's not here yet. Covid case levels are falling. More and more people are getting vaccinated. My family's car trips always ended – we always got there. The Israelites did eventually escape the wilderness, crossing the Jordan River into the Promised Land.

We will get there too. We will open for in-person worship. This may be the hardest part of the journey – when the frustration and loneliness and fatigue and resentment seem most overwhelming. For now we need to trust in God, and in Jesus who is in the wilderness with us. We need to help each other and draw strength from each other. We will get there.

# Why We Celebrate the Month of May

There are plenty of reasons to love May. It is the start of summer, flowers are blooming, and you can finally begin entertaining outdoors again. It is also a symbol of rebirth and new beginnings, an appropriate symbol of spring.

Whether it's Mother's Day, Memorial Day, World Press Freedom Day or National Buttermilk Biscuit Day, there's always something special to celebrate during the month of May. Here are a few things you can enjoy with your family and friends, or by yourself.

May 1st is May Day and is a festival that celebrates the arrival of Spring with the Maypole and by bringing in branches of forsythia, lilacs, or other flowering shrubs from your region.

May 3rd is World Press Freedom Day and was started to raise awareness of the importance of freedom of

the press and expression. No matter your political leanings or news outlet of choice, a free press is vital to all people and their knowledge of world happenings.

May 4th is Birds Day, and birds are pretty amazing. Many birds fly thousands of miles to migrate, and they're descendants of dinosaurs. What does the sparrow symbolize in the Bible? God's heart, kindness and compassion is so deep and wide that it extends to the smallest of creatures and the haughtiest of the them (the human!). Sparrows have also been referenced as symbols of freedom, in particular, the freedom for humans to have freewill and choose between good and evil.

#### **Church School - Spring 2021**

Church school continues using the WHIRL lectionary curriculum which offers many options for in-person and/or digital learning. The printed, lectionary-based resources originally intended for in-person learning are modified on a weekly basis to meet the needs of digital or virtual learning for the children and their families to utilize at home.

On several Sundays each month, families are sent via email, the lectionary-based scripture. Accompanying the scripture, is the day's theme or focus, an opening and/or closing prayer, suggestions for getting a discussion going, and suggestion(s) for a family activity to enhance the day's biblical scripture and lesson.

On March 21 and April 18, Jeff and Karlee co-hosted a special Church School Zoom Sing-Along. The children enjoyed conversation and singing with Jeff. He selects various songs, both familiar from past years and invites the children to join him in singing. Currently the children are relearning SPIRIT, SPIRIT

OF GENTLENESS. They will have several opportunities to practice on May 2, 9, 16 (via Zoom) in preparation for singing on Pentecost Sunday (prerecorded). With their family's permission and assistance, the children will record themselves, to participate in the worship on May 23 (Pentecost Sunday). The children all seem to enjoy the opportunity to sing together and look forward to more Sing-Alongs before the end of the current church school year.

On the second and fourth Sundays of each month, I host a Zoom gathering for the children at 11:00 or 12:00, depending on their ages/grades. During our 30-40 minutes together, we catch up with one another, recall the day's scripture read during worship, recall what church season we're celebrating, and then participate in a re-reading of the selected scripture. I also share an age-appropriate video based upon the day's biblical scripture and theme. The video provides a connection of the biblical scripture to daily life. Nearly every Zoom Sunday, I have had the usual attendance we expect with In-person worship and church school.

# **Pentecost Virtual Project**

I'm excited to announce that we will be offering a multi-media musical offering on Pentecost (Spirit of Gentleness) which will involve the chancel choir and the children's choir. All are welcome to participate by sending Audio or Video recordings to Jeff to be assembled into one project. Children and Chancel choirs are learning the song now. ### A little bit on "Singing Masks"

There are some companies offering expensive singing masks that purport to be extra comfortable for singers. These masks are not necessarily proven to reduce more "plumes" of droplets from our mouths while we sing. These masks can cost up to \$40 each. There is no additional "safety" in buying them. Still, they are large and spacious up front where they need to be. I do not think these expensive singers' masks are necessary, but some of my colleagues do like them. On the flip side, a regular blue surgical mask is not comfortable for singing at all in my opinion, and get caught in my mouth when breathing.

Instead, I have found that the inexpensive "KF94" masks billed as "3D", provide me just enough space up front to breath comfortably while singing. They have a light, horizontal, ridge around the nose that keeps material out of the my mouth. They also have a bottom lip that fits around the chin. "KF94 3D Masks" are Korean masks with near N95 filtration ("94") and are usually in stock at Husky Cleaners across from Big Y. I have also ordered approx 100 of these masks online (and some lanyards and glasses de-fogging wipes) in the event we need to put them to use. They are inexpensive and work just as well as the expensive ones. The only little drawback I have found is that they can fray a little bit on the edges.

I will be handing them out to choir when we slowly start to congregate once again. If you are interested in receiving a sample, I will be happy to provide you a care package! Please email

Music@NorthHavenUCC.org. Of course, physical distance is just as important when singing, and we will be combine these safe approaches as we return. You might also be surprised at how wonderful the pre-recorded singing sounds LIVE in the church. There are options for "hybrid music"! Of course, we continue to pray that herd immunity goes up and that cases per 100,000 go down.

#### **In-Person Worship Update**

There is good news to share! As of 4/22, COVID-19 case levels in North Haven have fallen to **26.8** per 100,000. Case levels have fallen consistently in April from a recent high of 39.5.


In-Person Worship remains suspended in response to a high level of COVID+ cases. Online Worship is still continuing each Sunday morning. The current CT Department of Public Health recommendation is to postpone indoor activities at case levels of 15/100000 or higher. The ReOpening Team has determined that the case level in North Haven and surround towns needs to be below 15 per 100,000 for two weeks before In-Person Worship indoors can be considered.

The Governor has just announced changes in the mandated COVID-19 restrictions and guidelines for May, and the CT Department of Public Health is expected to issue revise guidelines as well.

A Return to In-Person Worship Survey is collecting responses from the congregation through the Church website regarding comfort and interest in in-person worship and programming. Any decision to resume In-Person Worship will be shared promptly with church leadership and the congregation.

## **New Functionality on our Website**


Our Website now supports the ability to drag/drop files to be displayed on the website. This gives authorized users the ability to post documents on our website without requiring any programming skills.

On April 20, 2020, a group of women met in the church parking lot for lunch and fellowship! It was the idea of one woman who felt that it was important that somehow we meet and catch up with each other, because being alone during the pandemic had brought

on feelings of loneliness, sadness, and depression. It was decided to meet in the church parking lot, a place familiar to us and in the shadow of the church we all missed so much!

On that bright sunny, cold day, 6 women came with their chairs, winter coats, hats, gloves, and lunch! We sat in a circle 6 feet apart, sharing stories—some of good times, some of sad times. We laughed, and the love and fellowship was back! It was the best 2 hours of enjoying each other's company any of us had shared in a long time. The group became known as "PLP" (parking lot picnic).



We continued to meet on Tuesdays as the weather permitted. The group grew in size as the weather got warmer, and there were as many as 12 in attendance! We shared stories, books, and fresh vegetables from our gardens; we even shared meals to bring home. Very relaxing—no stress, no schedule, no time frame—we stayed as long or as short a time as we wanted. We've had very serious conversations and sometimes we just have fun and laughs. We never know how it will go, but it seems to always go well!

The longer the picnics continued, the closer we all became. We came up with ideas of things to do to get people back together again, in a safe manner.



We planned a birthday parade for Ellie Harple who was turning 90! In August, there was a 30-car procession complete with decorations, balloons, and so

many people; the parking lot was full from entrance to exit! Scott led the parade as the parade master, wearing his top hat and sash and carrying a cane!



In November, we held our first (hopefully only) Virtual Harvest Fair. It was different, yet it brought us together in a new way and the Fair was a success!

In January, we helped Lorraine Burdge celebrate her 93rd birthday with a noontime sing along (with masks) and balloons; even Emma (our canine member) joined in the fun!



We also sent cards to our homebound members for the holidays—Christmas, Valentine's Day, St Patrick's Day, and Easter.

This group of women has been such a gift to each one of us—a real blessing. It has helped us cope with loneliness, separation from our church family, and sadness when it was needed the most. We have all grown closer and have gotten to know each other on a new level.

Women's Fellowship hopes to get back to some of the activities we enjoyed before the pandemic once we are back inside the church. At that point we will have to see what the restrictions will be. Hopefully we can get back to meeting again to decide which activities we can safely handle and how to make it all work in our new environment!
