Springtime Poetry

Music can be associated with certain seasons of the year, and there are many songs (Walking on Sunshine, Under the Boardwalk, anything by the Beach Boys) that conjure sentiments of hot summer days. But for me, the arrival of spring compels me to read poetry. I rarely read poetry, and by no means am I an aficionado. I find most poetry to be opaque, and it has never resonated with me the way a well-crafted short story or novel does. But as the weathers warms and pollen proliferates, I find myself standing in front of our bookcase, reaching for two dusty old books that are part of what has become a springtime ritual.

Leaves of Grass by Walt Whitman - the title alone evokes lush lawns and spring blossoms. I have an old, illustrated, hardcover volume published in the 1950s. The binding is delicate, but the words contained within are vibrant and timeless. Whitman's words are a celebration, an opus that extols so many things that it is almost impossible to categorize or classify it. He touches on anything and everything that is meaningful to him - dear friends (dead or alive), nature, America, humanity, music, history, Democracy, love, struggles, children, God. The breadth of this work is vast, and I can open to any page and be immediately consumed by his eloquence and wisdom. At each reading his words reveal something new, something authentic and graceful that shifts my perspective, even if only momentarily.



The other book I take from the shelf is **Bratsk Station**, by Yevgeny Yevtushenko. Yevtushenko was a Russian poet who emerged after the death of Stalin, during the height of Soviet-era oppression. I have an old tattered paperback from 1967, and I honestly can't remember how I obtained it. It contains 26 long poems that honor the Russian land and her people. Although all of his

work had to be approved by the government, Yevtushenko pushed the censor's boundaries. He was widely popular with the Russian people, and his words are defiant, capturing the hope, fear, anger and anticipation of a wounded country as it struggled to free itself from repression.



The poems in these books are emblematic of each poet's heritage, and the people and conditions within their societies at the time they wrote them. Yet the words resonate with me in spring 2022, as they have in past springs, and once again have me heading to the bookcase, to pull down the dusty old books, and settle into a comfortable chair.

The ReOpening Team continues to follow the COVID case levels in our community. Case levels are up in North Haven and surrounding towns; the average as of 4/21 is 29.3 cases\ per 100,000. Church Building Open for In-Person Mask-Optional Gatherings

Church groups and community groups can meet in the church in-person and wearing a mask is optional. Eating and drinking are permitted. Safe distanced seating (6-feet apart) should be available for those who request it, and meetings should be restricted to two and a half hours.

As weather permits, windows should be open.

Anyone with a recent COVID diagnosis or who is not feeling well should not come into the building.
