

It is a lovely warm afternoon as I write these words. It doesn't feel like October! Soon it will be November. There is ample reason for gratitude as we anticipate the month of Thanksgiving.

Most of us who have wanted a COVID19 vaccination have been able to get it. Late breaking news indicates that vaccines may soon be available for children aged 5-11, and booster shots are widely available. The vaccination is the safest protection against the virus. COVID case levels in North Haven continue to fall, registering below 10 per 100,000, which means North Haven is now a yellow zone.



On Nov. 7, the first Sunday of the month, we will celebrate All Saints Sunday and give thanks to God for those among our congregation and our acquaintances who have died in the last year. We will welcome the children

to join in receiving Communion that day.

The Holiday Food Drive is underway, collecting contributions of non-perishable food and monetary donations for the purchase of fresh produce and dairy items. We anticipate we will provide food for more than 135 households. The experience of even this challenging year tells us we can anticipate tremendously generous donations, enthusiastic volunteers, and the joy of those who have received food in past years celebrating that changed lives and circumstances enable them to give so others can receive this year.

We will close the month of November by celebrating the first Sunday of Advent and looking ahead to continued celebration in December.

The call to give thanks to God in all circumstances is clear in the Christian gospel. The experience of feeling, and sharing, deep gratitude even among difficult circumstances is an experience and practice of faith: God is with us in every moment.

May you feel and celebrate and share God's blessing this Thanksgiving.

#### Reflections

As part of being a member of the MLB we are asked to put something in the Church Window.

My first memory of the North Haven Congregational Church was being picked up by my folks down stairs in what is now the Rainbow room, the Kindergarten Sunday school room, taught by Carolyn Jensen. A few years later as part of a youth group program I remember going tobogganing at Mrs. Beach's house which had long gently sloping fields. The fields were ideal for going down-hill but the long walk back up caused us to do crazy things. This is near where the Mt Carmel connector now goes under Ridge Rd. The last thing I remember about Church School was Bob Bristol leading us in 7<sup>th</sup> grade Bible lessons.

Rev Carroll led a confirmation class in which we had to memorize the 23<sup>rd</sup> Psalm. Then it was discovered I had not been baptized. So Rev Carroll baptized me just before I joined the Church.

Several years went by during which time I attended NHCC sporadically. I attended a few services at other Churches mainly in Atlanta. My life was coming together. I had graduated from UConn, completed my military active duty, married Sara, joined the family business and bought a home in North Haven. I went to Sara's Church at St Barnabus – St Francis Cabrini a few times but decided it was not working for me. As Sara went to Church nearly every Sunday I would find something else to do or go to NHCC as I felt comfortable there. I did find that if I didn't attend Church for too long I would feel a need to go.

One day at work Edna Sargent stopped in with a pledge card in hand. I had no idea of making a commitment. I would give when I went to Church. I could think of lots reasons why I should not make a commitment. She persisted that it was important for the Church to know the expected income for the next year. Even if it was a small amount it would be OK. Finally, I made a commitment of I'm embarrassed to say \$50. That was fifty years ago In today's dollars that might be nearer to \$500. As far as I know I have made a pledge every year since. Thankfully for the Church my Pledge has increased significantly since then.

#### In-Person Church School resumes.

Oh, the JOY of being back to In-person Church School since September 2021! On September 12, our children returned to In-Person church school for the first time in more than eighteen months! They rejoiced mightily and have enjoyed being back together again! Children in grades PreK-Grade 5, continue using the lectionary-based curriculum, SPARK: WHIRL. However, now that we're back to in-person Church school, they can enjoy making biblical theme-based crafts and utilize additional resources, too. Sue Baldino is teaching PreK-Grade 2, Steve Simonson is teaching Grades 3-5, and Karlee Etter is teaching Grades 6-7.

The curriculum for Grades 6-7, is called Mini Revolutions from Illustrated Ministries. This new curriculum for our young teens is also lectionarybased, and is designed with younger teens in mind. Each week, we begin our class-time with a miniworship service and prayer. Then the students take turns reading aloud from one lectionary-based selected scripture. We then begin our discussion with open-ended questions designed to help the teens imagine life as it may have been in biblical times, to connect personally with the story/scripture and find ways in which they might implement the Christian teachings and morals in their daily lives. Weekly activities help the students think creatively about the scripture through building and design, earth care, social justice, self-care and compassion, social/emotional learning. science, technology and art. Each day's lesson concludes with a closing prayer. October 31st is Reformation Sunday. It is a special day, not only on the church calendar, but also in the life of North Haven Congregational Church as this is the day in which each of our 4th Graders receives a gift Bible. This year, we will also celebrate our whole church community; because once again, the children's' Sunday morning schedule will begin by attending worship with their parents.

## **Advent Night RETURNS December 5, 2021!**

We are all looking forward to Advent Night 2021; another wonderful sign of things slowly returning to our community's new normal.

Every year many of us look forward to gathering with our church family to celebrate the beginning of Advent. This year it will be Sunday December 5th, from 3:00-5:00; beginning a couple of hours before the tree lighting on the green.

There will be lots of crafting opportunities from 3:00-4:30. We will close the festive evening with a brief Vesper service at 4:45. This year, unlike past years, we will be spread out across several rooms downstairs, allowing room for many crafts, favorites and new ones; and assist us in maintaining social distancing with masks, of course.

In order to make Advent Night a success, we hope many of you will offer to lead our families in your favorite holiday craft(s). **NHCC Sunday School** 







I have the privilege of spending an hour or more every Sunday morning with some very special people who are in third, fourth, and fifth grade. A class for sixth and seventh graders meets with Karlee Etter and a group of pre K through second grade meets with Sue Baldino. Each teacher was provided with age appropriate materials that had been selected by Karlee and affirmed by the Faith Formation Team.

I am grateful that I was given freedom to organize an agenda that we loosely follow each week. After four classes the children and I have settled in to the following agenda. I believe that the kids and I both benefit from a certain amount of repetition.

### Agenda:

- Prayer: opening prayer
- Discussion: How was your week? ⊕ and ⊕
- Focus topics: talk about one of the following: climate change, recycling, covid 19, ten commandments, bullies, etc
- Meditation
- Learning to sign the Lord's prayer
- "Hang Man": \_\_\_\_. Jesus
- Music with Jeff two or three times a month
- Consider looking at appropriate You Tube music videos
- Bible verse from the curriculum (see below)
- Going outside to play and do art on the sidewalk: (weather dependent)
- I am grateful for, "----"!
- Evaluate the class and make suggestions for improvements

So that is the skeleton of our 3-5 grade class. I emphasize the kids being leaders of the different sections. We may not cover every area, especially if the open ended discussions are going well and there is active participation. I do work hard to ensure that we read the Bible verse assigned each week.

Examples of the content and topic of the first four weeks are:

James chapter 3 verse 1-12 Taming the tongue; Kids learned words and bullies can be hurtful. Mark 9: 30-37 Jesus welcomed children. James 5: 13-20 Pray for one another

Mark 10: 13-16 Let the children come unto me.....from baptisms

Something we are exploring and hope to do is have the class join the adults on Saturday morning, October 23 for cleaning up the yard. Maybe plant some bulbs and fertilize. There is a good metaphor in there somewhere.

I know the church is looking for adults to join in and become members of the Faith formation Team or as part time and substitute teachers. I promise you that you will get more out of it than you put in.

For many years, evaluations of our church staff have been inconsistently conducted. This is unfair to both our employees, who need and expect regular feedback, and the congregation, which ultimately holds the employees accountable. After all, "We (the congregation) are the Church."

I encourage everyone in the church to please take the time, over the next several weeks, to go the church's website, click on to the two banners on its masthead titled "Annual Evaluation (STAFF)" and "Annual Evaluation (MINISTER)" and complete the two forms. Caution: when you select the STAFF evaluation option, please use the drop-down box to make sure you evaluate all staff members individually: Office Manager Julie; Ministry Coordinator for Children Karlee; Director of Music Jeffrey; Organist Gary; and Sexton Todd.

We conducted Pastor Scott's evaluation online last year for the first time and the results were very encouraging, with more than fifty congregants participating, so we have expanded the process this year to include the staff as well. Please recognize that YOUR constructive insights matter.

The timeline for completing this year's evaluation process has been established as follows by the Personnel Mission Team: date the next Window goes out – October 27th; date by which evaluations need to be completed – November 29th; and date of the next MLB Meeting, by which time the evaluations need to be summarized – December 8th.



## **Changes for Prayers Listed in Sunday**

**Bulletin** Each week the worship bulletin includes a list called In Our Prayers This Week. This is a list of names of persons the congregation is invited to pray for during the week. The names are read, with no additional information, during the pastoral prayer. Requests for names to be included may come from the individuals themselves, family members or friends, or church staff.

In an effort to keep this list timely and uniform, we will list names in the bulletin for a period of two months. Prayer requests should be submitted by email or phone to Julie or Scott by noon on Wednesday for inclusion in the upcoming Sunday's bulletin. These prayer requests can be updated and submitted for two subsequent two-month periods.

## **Pastoral Prayers On Sunday**

In addition to the IN OUR PRAYERS THIS WEEK list in the Sunday bulletin, there are two additional lists included in the pastoral prayer on Sunday. One is a list of current prayer concerns submitted by email. Before the pandemic these prayer concerns were written on slips of paper and collected by a Deacon and read just before the pastoral prayer. Current prayer concerns, with name and brief background, can be emailed to Scott or left by voicemail up until 8:30am on Sunday morning. These are read each Sunday.

The second list is longer-term prayers - bereavement, recovery from surgery, treatment for cancer, etc. These prayers, with name and brief background, often follow up on prayers emailed earlier. They are included frequently in the pastoral prayer.

If you questions about including prayers in the worship service, please contact Scott or Julie.

## **In-Person Worship Every Week**

We are still continuing with in-person worship services on Sunday morning. COVID-19 case levels in North Haven and surrounding towns have decreased slightly in recent weeks. As of Oct. 14, North Haven reported a case level of **9.7** per 100,000, meaning North Haven is now a yellow zone.

The ReOpening Team has decided that in-person worship will continue unless the case levels rise significantly higher.

The following precautions remain in place, for now, for In-Person Worship:

- Attendees are asked to sign in when they arrive; there is no longer any preregistration
- Attendees can choose between socially distanced pews (household groups maintain 6-foot distance) and open pews (vaccinated people can opt to sit together)
- Attendees must wear masks, sing softly, and refrain from eating or drinking in the building.
- Windows will be open, fans blowing outward only
- Bathrooms will be open
- Sanctuary will be open beginning at 9:00a.m.

Beginning on Sunday, Oct. 31, the children will come into worship again. On regular Sundays they will come in for the beginning of the service and then go to their Sunday School classes. On Communion Sundays, the children will go directly to their Sunday School class, and then come to the sanctuary for Communion. Children will sit with their parents in socially-distanced pews.



## **Clean Energy Task Force supports Food**

**Pantry** The North Haven Clean Energy Task Force presented a check for \$6075 to the Food Pantry at NHCC. The funds come from home energy audits performed in the Task Force program to reduce energy costs and support energy sustainability in North Haven. Each home audit generates a \$25 charitable contribution. This year the charitable contributions were split between the Food Pantry at our Church and the Town Food Pantry run by the Department of Community Services.

## **Neighbors In Need Offering**

The Neighbors In Need special offering was received on Sunday, October 3. The Neighbors In Need offering is an all-church special offering across the United Church of Christ. It is dedicated to programs of community building and engagement and social justice around the United States. The offering raised \$605, to be shared with the Council for American Indian Ministries for community building and engagement and social justice efforts, and with Justice and Witness Ministries for service projects, and advocacy efforts. Thank you for your generosity!

Celebrating Bible Sunday! – We celebrated Bible Sunday on Reformation Sunday, which was October 31<sup>st</sup> this year. Each year we present Bibles to church school youth in the fourth grade.
