## Crossing the Threshold

Our Congregational tradition is particular and distinct. The congregation is led by a lay moderator and holds authority over church life and program. The pastoral role is not over the people – between them and God – but rather among the people, teaching, empowering and encouraging. The congregation determines its organizational structure and its budget.

The last two years have been quite a disruption to our congregational ways. We have been separated and isolated. We were not able to gather together for worship in-person. In these difficult circumstances, a worship service livestreamed and available on laptop computers, tablets, or phones has been a surprising and precious opportunity to maintain connection and faithful worship. The camera and sound equipment, and the talents of church members and staff, made it possible for us to sing and pray and hope together when we could not be present to each other.

The livestreamed service is not a replacement for gathered, in-person worship, though.

This remarkable livestreaming ability will not be shut down and put away; there are church members and friends who are not able to come to church because of personal circumstance. We want to continue to offer loving welcome and the ability to be among the congregation from a distance.

For most of us, though, it is no longer necessary to worship from a distance – it is no longer a risk to health.

It may be comfortable to worship from home; it may be convenient, it may feel like a routine now. Jesus calls us to follow him in community, to worship and serve among the congregation. Our singing needs many voices, our prayer needs many hearts, our mission and service needs many hands.

This is a threshold moment for the church. We need more younger members in leadership. We need new connection and collaboration with community programs and agencies to reinvigorate our mission efforts.

I invite you and I urge you to come back to church. Come to worship. Come have breakfast or a picnic lunch in the parking lot. Come to our Threshold Regathering morning on Saturday, September 17. Come and find your place among the congregation.

**Summer Sunday School: Living in the Moment**



With an Attitude of Gratitude I grew up believing the glass was always “half full”. My parents always greeted their grandchildren with, “You make me glad”. In my Summer Sunday School class (Thomas, Patty, Gabriella, Jameson, Joseph, Saydee, Sienna, Kaitlyn, Coral, Noah, Odin, and visiting children from the community) “make me glad”. During the summer we met ten times and had as few as two or as many as ten students. I thank and congratulate the parents or grandparents of this group, because as you know the students don’t drive themselves to church. Based upon the smiles, laughter, and general positive energy, I think these classes were successful. I believe the format of the class contributed to this, for example: First each student has paper, pencils,

crayons, glue and scissors to use as they choose. My observations supported that they paid better attention to what we were doing with this bit of structure. The second primary strategy was to encourage the students to take turns leading the class in a “show and tell” type format. This was particularly needed given the one room school house structure given age range from five to ten and eleven. This approach allows the older children the opportunity to be leaders and helpers of the younger kids. This also empowers all of the students to learn from one another and realize that we are not on this journey alone. The agenda was made up of the following: Introductions (sometimes we had visitors) ; sharing what we liked or dislikes about the past week or what are we excited about doing this coming week; singing and signing “Jesus loves me this I know”; blowing bubbles; playing water balloon toss; keeping regular balloons in the air; playing “the wonder ball goes round and round”; having a brief meditative prayerful moment; playing Christian Hangmen; drawing pictures with chalk on the back driveway; playing jump the brook; telling stories about Jesus from the Bible; creative games with cups and ping pong balls, etc.

Learning to live in the moment and having an attitude of gratitude is not a bad place to start. This week, and in all the weeks ahead let us find ways to say, “Thank You”, to be nourished by gratitude. To celebrate our community, to be gentle with ourselves, each other, our children and our friends. And remember to share with others, “You make me glad”. Thich Nhat Hanh reminds us, “Our life can only be lived in the present moment. The miracle is not to walk on water. The miracle is to be aware while you walk on the green earth in the present moment. Meister Eckert’s advice, “If you can only learn one prayer, make it this one: Thank you.” Stephen Simonson

P.S. The Faith Formation Mission Team wants to encourage you to consider volunteering as a full or part time teacher. The only required qualifications are to be committed to having fun, be respectful and remember “You make me glad”.

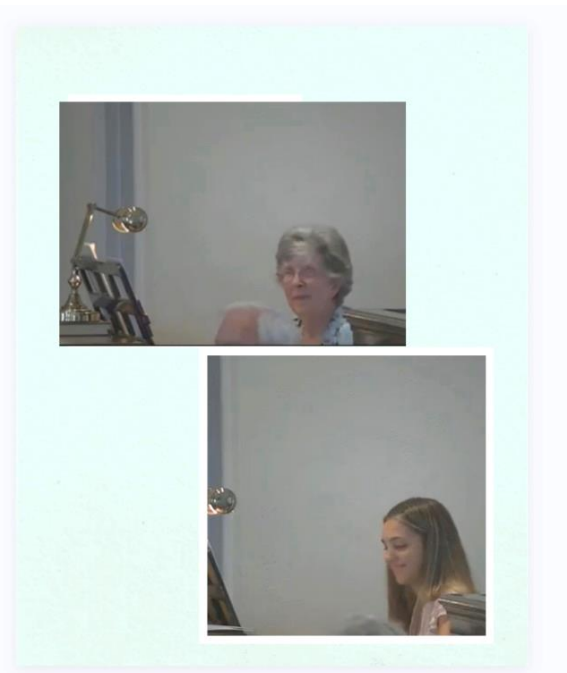

The Third Annual Meeting of the Southern New England Conference of the United Church of Christ was held virtually on Saturday, June 18, from 9am – 2:30pm. The worship services at the beginning and the end of the meeting brought inspiration and joy to the day. Keynote speaker the Rev. Dr. Patrick Duggan, Executive Director of the UCC Church Building & Loan Fund detailed a number of creative projects congregations have used to expand or re-purpose portions of their building in order attract new strains of financial support. Executive Conference Minister Rev. Darrell Goodwin, spoke in the afternoon.

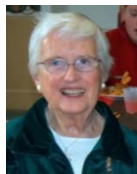

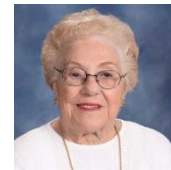
