NHCC Endowment

Our Church, the North Haven Congregational Church, is very fortunate to have an Endowment. I will attempt to explain the workings and the purpose of the Endowment.

You may wonder what an Endowment is. One easy to understand definition from Colliers dictionary is: “An endowment is a gift of money that is made to an institution or community in order to provide it with an annual income.”

Our Church has established a policy concerning our Endowment part of which states:

- it provides guidance for members and friends of the congregation who wish to make a permanent gift to the Church;
- it delineates how these gifts will be invested, managed, and expended; and
- it assures donors that their gifts will be prudently managed in perpetuity.

The first gift of record to the North Haven Congregational Church Endowment was in 1907. Since there have been two Church fires our records are sketchy until the nineteen forties. Since that time many bequests and gifts have been given to the Endowment. Some are restricted gifts which mean the income from that fund is to be used for a specific purpose in the Church like music, church maintenance, Christian Education, etc. If there is no specific purpose noted it becomes part of the unrestricted funds in the Endowment. We prefer gifts and bequests be made to the unrestricted fund so they will support the entire Church.

Our Church’s Endowment attempts to invest so there is a growth of principal while providing income to the Church operating budget. The Endowment funds are managed separately from other Church funds by an Endowment team which meets quarterly. The funds are held at UBS, a large brokerage firm with an office in New Haven. Our current Advisor is Mike Haggerty Jr. Investments are made primarily in mutual funds and bonds. The Financial Agent brings a UBS report to each monthly meeting of the Church MLB.

Income to the Church budget is calculated by using the average of the prior 16 calendar quarters by 4.25%

for restricted funds and by 4.5% for unrestricted funds. This averaging reduces the impact of the market ups and downs as is happening now. Over time it provides greater predictable income to the Church than putting money in a bank account, with no hope of keeping up with inflation.

Please find two Biblical passages which we should think about.

Matthew 2:11b – “Opening their treasures, they offered him gifts...” Read this passage in the third person, then in the first person. Endowment gifts usually come from treasures, our accumulated assets.

Genesis 26:17-25 – “And Isaac dug again the wells of water which had been dug in the days of Abraham his father...” Leave something behind which is better than what you found.

I encourage you to make a New Years’ resolution to generously include the North Haven Congregational Church in your Will in proportion to the Church’s importance in your life, I have. If you have previously included the Church in your Will, thank you.

We have received a \$10,000 bequest from the estate of Lorraine Burge. On behalf of the Endowment Team we thank Lorraine for her generosity.



Church School Pageant – Christmas Eve, 4:30 Family Service

In late October, after much discussion with staff, members of the Faith Formation Team, and parents, it was decided to present the Christmas pageant on Christmas Eve as part of the 4:30 Family Service. For several years now, many of our children were unable to participate because of other commitments on the Sunday before Christmas, the usual date for our pageant. In presenting the pageant on Christmas Eve, every child has the opportunity to participate in this memorable experience of expressing themselves in one of our congregation's most beloved traditions of the church year.

This year's pageant is titled, MARY'S SONG, and is based on the first Christmas story found in Luke 2:1-20. However, as the title suggests, the story, although narrated by several characters including an older Mary, provides Mary's point-of-view (POV) as she recalls the birth of her son, Jesus. Mary serves as the primary narrator, followed by the POV of three other characters: CHRISTIAN, (a Christian), JOEL (a shepherd), and MATTHEW (a traveler who met the Wisemen as they traveled to Bethlehem). As the four narrators tell the story, each of the traditional characters move toward the front of the sanctuary, concluding with a tableau of the living creche.

NHCC annual traditional church school pageant will be an integral part of the Family worship at 4:30 p.m., interwoven with narratives from the Gospel of Luke, prayers, gifts of music, and Christmas hymns. I hope many will join us in the telling of the favorite story of the First Christmas.

Volunteers from the churches in North Haven, along with Girl Scouts and Boy Scouts helped with food collection, sorting, packing and delivery. This is the highest number of household we have ever tried to serve, and we are very glad our neighbors will be able to enjoy a brighter and more delicious Thanksgiving holiday.


During the pandemic, congregations were not able to host Abraham’s Tent guests. Now planning is underway for a resumption of hosting by several congregations with a reduced schedule.


