Through a comprehensive selection process, prospective Habitat families undergo a thorough financial review and complete 400 hours of "sweat equity" working on Habitat homes under construction. The passing of the hammer celebrates their accomplishment and their commitment to continue to care for their home. Prayers of joy and celebration were offered as the Tirado family gathered on their front porch!



Holiday Food Drive 2022 Has Begun!

The Food Drive Council met recently to begin the planning for the 2022 Holiday Food Drive. The Council consists of members of churches and civic groups in North Haven which support the Food Pantry and the Holiday Food Drive. The distribution of food from the Food Pantry has increased by a range of 25% to 88% this year. We expect an increased need for the Holiday Food Drive as well, and planning for the maximum capacity of assistance is underway. Procedures for food collection and sorting, packing and pick-up/delivery of food boxes will allow for safe distancing.. Volunteers will work in small groups, and the hours for sorting, packing, and pick-up/delivery will be extended. Donations of food and money are down from last year, and volunteers have been shopping regularly for items that have run out. Through the leadership of John Tibor, we anticipate beginning a partnership with Connecticut Food Share allowing us to shop for the Food Pantry at greatly reduced prices. We will also resume the collection of non-perishable food on Communion Sundays beginning this month.



Bring Non-Perishable Food Items Oct. 2

We will resume collecting donations of nonperishable food items on Sunday mornings beginning October 2. Please bring hearty canned soup, vegetables (especially carrots, beets, peas, and mixed vegtables), juice, shelf-stable milk, tuna fish, canned chicken, tea, coffee, peanut butter, or jelly and place them in the basket in the Narthex. Thank you!

Neighbors In Need Offering set for Oct. 2

On Sunday, October 2, we will receive the Neighbors In Need Offering for 2022. The Neighbors In Need offering is an all-church special offering across the United Church of Christ. It is dedicated to programs of community building and engagement and social justice around the United States. Two-thirds of the offering is used by the UCC's Justice and Witness Ministries to fund a wide array of local and national justice initiatives, advocacy efforts, and direct service projects.

One-third of the offering supports the UCC's Council for American Indian Ministries (CAIM). Historically, forebears of the UCC established churches and worked with Lakota, Dakota, Nakota, Mandan, Hidatsa, Arickara, and Hocak in North and South Dakota, Wisconsin, and northern Nebraska. Today there are 20 UCC congregations on reservations and one urban, multi-tribal UCC congregation in Minneapolis, Minnesota. These churches and their pastors are supported by CAIM. CAIM is also an invaluable resource for more than 1,000 individuals from dozens of other tribes and nations who are members of other UCC congregations in the U.S. I encourage you to give prayerfully and generously. 
