invite and encourage them to come to worship, to come to Parking Lot Picnic, to come to Fellowship Breakfast and feel the joy of being together. Invite them to come and join in packing food boxes or singing in the choir or helping with the Church School or the Youth Group.

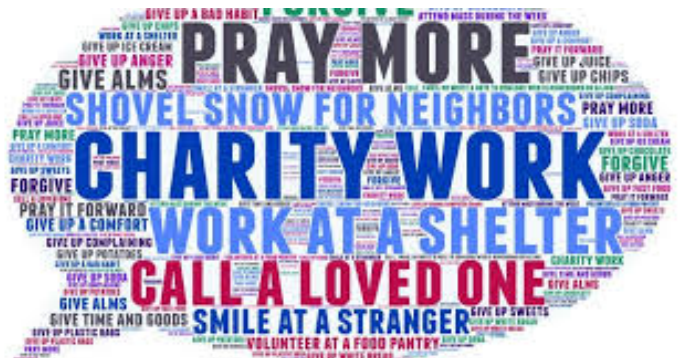
Let us pray for body – for all its members – and for the gifts we can share.

Giving During Lent

We enter the season of Lent on February 22, a time for spiritual preparation for Easter. This is a time to reflect on Jesus Christ’s suffering, sacrifice, life, death and resurrection. During Lent, some Christians refrain from eating a favorite food or give up a bad habit. Additionally, many Christians devote extra time to reading the bible and/or praying as a way to understand Jesus’s life and his mission for us as his disciples.

Rather than give up a bad habit, one can initiate a good habit. As we come out the COVID pandemic, a period when many of us have had to refrain from interacting with our family, friends and community as we did in the past, I urge us all to recommit to giving to our family, friends and community during Lent.

Think about Jesus’s generosity as you donate food to the food pantry, used clothing to the needy, money to help earthquake victims or money to the disaster, refuge and development ministries of the United Church of Christ through the One Great Hour of Sharing offering.

Think about Jesus’s hospitality as you perform an errand for a neighbor such as bringing them a home-cooked meal, taking them to a doctor’s appointment or just visiting with them they are lonely. Give your time and talents to the church by volunteering to be a greeter, a coffee hour host or a reader or by attending the St Patrick’s Day Dinner on March 12 or helping out with the Spring Cleanup Day later in March.

We can all, no matter how young or old, commit to being kind to others and doing a good deed every day during the 40 days of Lent. If we focus on helping others and reflect on what it means to be a disciple of Christ, we will be prepared spiritually for Christ’s resurrection on Easter.

In preparation for Youth Sunday, and on select Sundays through May 7th, a special curriculum will be used to help the children better understand the SEASONS OF THE SON (the Church Year); its various themes, colors, symbols, prayers, scripture and hymns. May 21st worship will be a culmination of that learning, offer an opportunity for the children to lead the congregation in worship and share their new knowledge of the church year with their church family.

Joining the Church

Worship is In-Person and Online

We are glad to continue our in-person worship services and masks are optional. We are enjoying Coffee Hour following worship, and we encourage volunteers to sign up to host. For the most part, people who get COVID are not having dangerous symptoms. We will continue to livestream the worship service through the church website for those who cannot attend in-person by choice or circumstance.

If you are not feeling well or you have had a COVID exposure, consider staying at home. Please wear a mask if you must come into the church.

A Word About Nametags

As we gather on Sunday mornings for worship, many of us enter through the front doors where we are greeted given a Sunday Bulletin, and reminded to put on our nametags which are found in the black Nametag Case hanging on the left side of the Narthex. The idea is to wear your nametags during worship and to Coffee Hour, if you choose to attend, and put them in the

nametag basket before leaving. Wearing a nametag is a good way to help remember names of those whose faces are familiar but name eludes us. It can also help a visitor feel more comfortable by seeing our names and for us to know their name without asking. There is a basket in the Narthex and another in Carroll Hall for nametags to be placed in depending on which door you go out. During the week, the names are recorded in Servant Keeper, and the nametags are put back in the Nametag Case to be taken out the next Sunday and worn again. Keeping the list of names of those in attendance each Sunday is important for contact tracing in case of a Covid-19 exposure, and to know who was in the congregation in addition to the head count which is done each week by a Deacon. Helping with this task doesn't take long and is a great help to Julie who needs to stay in the office to work on the computer, answer the phone and let people into the building by remotely unlocking the door.

There are many nametags, one for each member, friend, and guest. The left side and the middle section of the case were getting crowded and it may have been difficult to find the nametag you were looking for. Some nametags have been moved to the right side of the case to free up space for the ones used more frequently. If you haven't been to church in a long time, your nametag is most likely hanging on the right side of the Nametag Case. When you come to church again, your nametag will be waiting for you. We would love to see the pews as full as the Nametag Case!

United Church of Christ Issues Turkey and Syria Earthquake Appeal

In the aftermath of one of the strongest earthquakes in 100 years, the United Church of Christ Global H.O.P.E. team has issued an appeal for financial contributions toward rescue, recovery, and resettlement work in the Turkey and Syria region. Global H.O.P.E. is working with partners at the Gazientep Hospital in Gazientep, Turkey, which the UCC helped to found and provided a missionary presence. The hospital was not seriously damaged, although Gazientep is one of the ten cities badly affected. They are also working in Syria through the Middle East Council of Churches. Several people have been rescued from the rubble in Turkey in recent days, after being trapped for more

than 200 hours. The estimate for casualties from the earthquake now exceeds 41,000. The greatest needs are for equipment for rescue and recovery, food and water and basic amenities, medical supplies, and materials for repair and resettlement.

The Global H.O.P.E. team in United Church of Christ Wider Church Ministries brings together the UCC's refugee and migration ministries, volunteer engagement, disaster response and recovery, and sustainable development support. The acronym H.O.P.E. makes clear the team's vision: Humanitarian. Opportunities. Progress. Empowerment.

Membership Review by Worship Team

The Worship Team is working to complete a review of the church membership records which was begun several years ago and disrupted by the pandemic. The goal of this review is to assure that the records reflect accurately the records of active membership of the church. This review will involve written contact with members regarding their membership status. The bylaws of the church describe the responsibilities of active membership in the church as regular participation in worship, sharing in the work of the church and of its Mission Teams, care for each other, and financial support for the church. Participation in any of these responsibilities constitutes active membership. In addition to active membership, there is a category of inactive membership, which is limited to one year. It is important that the membership records are accurate and transparent. Active church membership determines the number of representatives the church may send to meetings of the Consociation and Conference. It also determines the financial support the church is obligated to provide to the Consociation.

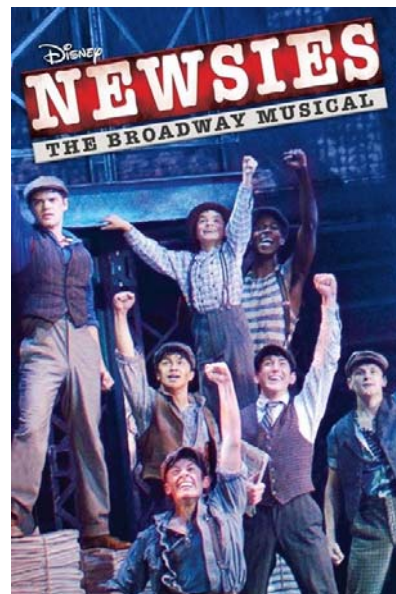

The One Great Hour of Sharing, which is part of Our Church's Wider Mission, is the special mission offering of the United Church of Christ provides for people in crisis throughout the world. The UCC works with other churches and international partners to sources of clean water, food, education and health care, small business micro-credit, advocacy and resettlement for refugees and displaced persons, and emergency relief and rehabilitation. One Great Hour of Sharing also supports domestic and international ministries for disaster preparedness and response. The Christian denominations and agencies supporting One Great Hour of Sharing include the American Baptist Church, Christian Church (Disciples of Christ), Church of the Brethren, the United Church of Christ, and Church World Service. The UCC offering supports 2 One Great Hour of Sharing missionaries and 1 Global

Mission Intern working in disaster relief, health care, education, sustainable agricultural development, and refugee support. On average, of every dollar given to One Great Hour of Sharing, 95 cents is used directly for mission programming; and 5 cents for interpretation materials. Please give generously on March 19!
