I have served on the Buildings and Grounds for many years and can attest to all the hard work everyone on this committee has done on numerous projects helping to maintain both the church and parsonage in good condition, some visible and others hidden within the walls and attic. However, one recent work that is clearly noticeable is the repair to the bell support in the steeple which, until recently, hasn’t been rung in years due to defective framing. With the help of the F. J. Dahill Comp. Inc. and B&G members, including Pete Struk, the framing was made plumb and level permitting the bell to swing freely and ring clearly calling us all to gather for Sunday service. This repair required coordination, time, planning and funds.

Recently the organist search committee under the faithful leadership of Cathy Welch, hired Heather Meachen as our new organist and the choir looks forward to all the great music we will make every Sunday. YOUTH SUNDAY, May 21, 2023 "SEASONS OF THE SON"



On May 21, 2023 our church school children were active participants during the morning's worship. It was a day to celebrate our children and to give the younger members of our church family an opportunity to share their faith, by providing them with an active hand in leading their families and the adults in worship. It was a day to give the congregation a glimpse into the weekly happenings of church school.

Although the children do not learn about all six seasons of the church year every week, the church school curriculum from September through May, does focus on the suggested lectionary of the United Church of Christ. During the Advent season, the lessons focus on the preparation for Jesus' birth. At Christmas, the lectionary focus's on Jesus's birth. During Epiphany, the theme is the visit of the Magi to Baby Jesus and God's gift to us of his only son. During Lent, we focus on Jesus's forty days in the desert. With Easter, of course, Jesus's resurrection. Finally during Pentecost, we celebrate the arrival of the Holy Spirit to all Jesus' followers (not just His disciples), as well as Jesus's ministry and the growth of the early Christian church. In other words, Youth Sunday on May 21st focused on all the SEASONS OF the SON and is a culmination of a complete church school year's, September through May, weekly scriptures/stories and focus/themes.

Men’s Fellowship

We continue with our twice a month breakfast schedule, congregating most recently in Carroll Hall’s kitchen on both April 15th and May 6th. Scott Morrow, Bryant Munson, Tim Peiffer, and John Tibor) were present at our first-noted get-together; and our numbers grew to eleven for our second one, picking up Fran Dutko, Tom Glynn, Paul Powers, and Stephen Simonson while losing Martin.

Our format for these breakfasts is very unstructured. Men drift in over the course of thirty or so minutes, greet each other, and migrate to diverse areas to converse in smaller groups or person to person on a whole range of topics. The morning’s cook, be it John or Tim, chases each attendee down (in order of his arrival) at some point to obtain that person’s breakfast order, and time is always allowed for Pastor Scott to brief us on church happenings and for Tim to bring us

together for an appropriate devotional. That's it for structure, unless I have some North Haven Lions Club event to plug.
