November will be a busy month in our Church! I'm sure you're excited already! We will celebrate Generosity Sunday and welcome new members. And then, in the fourth week of November, we will celebrate Thanksgiving.

November is a GOOD time to consider how gratitude flows in our lives. Many of us have busy schedules and long lists that keep us moving at a good clip. We need to slow down – we need at least to pause – in order to *feel* our gratitude. There is enough beauty, enough rousing music, enough sunshine or moonlight, enough excitement and anticipation to prompt us to feel grateful. A daily moment, either when starting off in the morning or before sleep at night, of noticing and paying attention to *feeling thankful* is a wonderful habit.

Feeling thankful is a great prompt for *saying thanks*. Saying "thank you!" with a smile, holding the gaze, seals the expression and sharing of thankfulness. We know the good feeling of being thanked.

Saying thanks is a boost to *giving thanks*. We can give thanks through prayer, through donating or devoting time or money, or through visiting and conversation. Listening is a way

to give thanks; so is joining in and helping with a shared endeavor.

Feeling, saying and giving thanks is a cycle of power and joy. We feel stronger and more joyful when we are thankful, and when we feel stronger and more joyful we feel *more* thankful.

May this be a blessing for you this November, and this Thanksgiving!



From the Moderator-

Dear North Haven Congregational Members and Friends,

It has been a difficult year for the church budget. Pledges are by far the largest part of the Church's income and the pledge contributions are less this year than last. Also, this year past due pledges of \$900 were never received from last year and as of this writing we have received \$10,000 less than what we had anticipated receiving by this time in the year.

Other sources of income include proceeds from the endowment which are committed during the budget process and provided during the year. Unrestricted gifts are doing well, thanks in part to one-time gifts of \$1,000 each from the Men's and Women's Fellowships.

Fundraising has been challenging and we have not yet raised the budgeted amount for the year. We have had success with the On-Line Auction, Military Whist and Pink Sunday coffee hour, but need your help to make the remaining events successful. In the near future, we have planned a Comedy night, a Pierpont concert, a Girls Choir concert, and the Harvest Fair. I hope we have a good turnout for these events!! We need the money!

Finally, our budget depends on outside groups using our facilities. We are fortunate to have a diverse set of groups renting space, including the Children's Music programs who meet in the double classroom, on the average of 9 meetings a week. We also have a clothing box that has been placed along the back driveway of the Church which contributes \$900 per year to our budget. All of these are very valuable sources of income.

Our Treasurer has informed the Ministry Leadership Board that we can anticipate some savings on some of our expenses, including insurance and utilities, but Building and Grounds is already over budget due to some emergencies, including, plumbing and spraying for bees and ants.

I don't want to sound bleak, however, I want our Treasurers to be able to pay the bills - including salaries and benefits, insurance, and utilities. If you are behind in your pledges, if possible, please get up to date. If you can contribute a bit more, that would be wonderful! Thank you to all who are current in their pledges.

In closing, if you have any ideas for fundraising or know outside groups looking for rental space, let me know!

BIBLE SUNDAY was October 29, 2023 This year four children were awarded gift Bibles during worship on October 29th: Sienna Baldino, Colton Donle, Tyler Gannon, and Thomas Jennings. Congratulations to this year's fourth graders.

By fourth grade, children recognize the Bible as a central book for all people of faith; as a building block of faith and thereby recognize its relevance for daily life. The Bible helps children come to know God through stories about people of faith, the teachings of Jesus, and the history of the Bible. The Bible also provides, for all God's people, passages for help, comfort, and guidance in times of sorrow.

WORSHIP BULLETINS for CHILDREN: This year, children's worship bulletins will be provided for all Family Sundays. They provide the children with a sense of belonging and a creative outlet that involves them in worship. They provide biblically-based activities for the children to complete during worship, thereby providing enrichment for the day's message/scripture, which in turn reinforce the day's theme. The children's bulletins are available for two levels; one for non-readers and one for readers. There is also a coloring page.

Contributions of non-perishable food items arrive daily, and collection boxes are in place in shops and businesses throughout North Haven. The North Haven Rotary Club, in partnership with Liberty Bank, will provide a generous 25% match for all money donations received through November 13. Monetary donations are down from the peak during the pandemic. Financial contributions go toward the purchase of items where food donations don't fill the amount needed.

Our goal for this year is to serve up to 185 households. This is actually more boxes of food than we can fit on all the tables at Church! The distribution of food from the Food Pantry has increased by a almost 50% this year. We expect an increased need for the Holiday Food Drive as well, and we are ready! John Tibor has been shopping regularly for the at Connecticut Food Share the Food Pantry at greatly reduced prices. Procedures for food collection and sorting, packing and pick-up/delivery of food boxes will allow for safe distancing.. Volunteers will work in small groups, and the hours for sorting, packing, and pick-up/delivery will be extended. Please watch the church website to sign up to volunteer. You can help with packing the boxes on Thursday, Nov. 16, between 2 and 4pm, and on Friday, Nov. 17 between 3 and 7pm. You can also

help with deliveries on Saturday morning, Nov. 18, between 9am and 1pm.
