

The Holiday Food Drive 2023 Has Begun!

The Food Drive Council met recently to begin the planning for the 2023 Holiday Food Drive. The Council consists of members of churches and civic groups in North Haven which support the Food Pantry and the Holiday Food Drive. The distribution of food from the Food Pantry has increased by 50% this year. We expect an increased need for the Holiday Food Drive as well, and we are planning for the maximum capacity of assistance once again. Volunteers will work in small groups, and the hours for sorting, packing, and pick-up/delivery will be extended.

Donations of food are down overall, and volunteers shop regularly for items that have run out. Through the leadership of John Tibor, we work in partnership with Connecticut Food Share, which allows us to shop for the Food Pantry at greatly reduced prices. This is a very important resource since shop so frequently. There is great support from the churches of North Haven. On Sunday, September 24th, the three churches of St. Elizabeth of the Trinity donated over 175 bags of food. We will also resume the collection of non-perishable food on Communion Sundays beginning this month.

The Registrar prepared the annual report of the Consociation, schedules the Annual Meeting and other occasional meetings, and communicates with the delegates appointed by each congregation. The Treasurer maintains the financial records of the Consociation, prepares the proposed budget each year, and pays the bills. The Auditor examines the books annually and prepares a report for the Annual Meeting. Jean Green, of North Guilford Congregational Church, has been the Registrar for many years. John Tibor has served as the Treasurer for a number of years, and Melissa DeLuca has served as the Auditor.

Neighbors In Need Offering set for Oct. 1

On Sunday, October 1st, we will receive the Neighbors In Need Offering for 2023. The Neighbors In Need offering is an all-church special offering across the United Church of Christ. The offering supports the United Church of Christ ministries of justice and compassion throughout the United States. Two-thirds of the offering is used by the UCC's Justice and Witness Ministries to fund a wide array of local and national justice initiatives, advocacy efforts, and direct service projects.

One-third of the offering supports the UCC's Council for American Indian Ministries (CAIM). Historically, forebears of the UCC established churches and worked with Lakota, Dakota, Nakota, Mandan, Hidatsa, Arickara, and Hocak in North and South Dakota,

Wisconsin, and northern Nebraska. Today there are 20 UCC congregations on reservations and one urban, multi-tribal UCC congregation in Minneapolis, Minnesota. These churches and their pastors are supported by CAIM. CAIM is also an invaluable resource for more than 1,000 individuals from dozens of other tribes and nations who are members of other UCC congregations in the U.S. I encourage you to give prayerfully and generously. You may mail your gifts to the church, marked "Neighbors In Need" or "NIN", or you may make your gift online, either through the church or directly to NIN.
