After he said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." When he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained."

But Thomas (who was called the Twin), one of the twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. So the other disciples told him, "We have seen the Lord." But he said to them, "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands and put my finger in the mark of the nails and my hand in his side, I will not believe."

A week later his disciples were again in the house, and Thomas was with them. Although the doors were shut, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here and see my hands. Reach out your hand and put

it in my side. Do not doubt but believe." Thomas answered him, "My Lord and my God!" Jesus said to him, "Have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have come to believe."

Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples that are not written in this book. But these are written so that you may continue to believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that through believing you may have life in his name.

#### **Mission Team Spotlight**

This week's Mission Team Spotlight is Memorial Gifts. Barbara Massey and Cathy Welch are the Memorial Gifts Team members. Funds comes into the Memorial Gifts account when a church member or friend makes a special contribution to the church, usually in honor of someone who has passed away. Donations have also been received in honor of a special occasion such as a family member or friend's birthday or anniversary. At times, the gifts are designated to specific funds such as the children's library, the Food Pantry, the Music Fund, and others. These funds are then used for special church projects when requested and by other church teams. For example, some years ago, a new communion table cover and paraments were requested by the Deacons and funds for these were approved by Memorial Gifts and purchased. Other examples of how the Memorial Gift's funds have been used include the beautiful teak bench outside the sanctuary, the very useful birch table in Carroll Hall, new flooring in the choir room, the rebinding of Voices United and Pilgrim hymnals, updating of the fire and security systems throughout the building, and the list goes on. All contributions are used to benefit the workings and beautification of the church to which the Team is very grateful. #### Taking Back Unwanted Prescription Drugs On Saturday, April 27th at Fire Headquarters from 10am – 2pm

The Town of North Haven and the Drug Enforcement Agency (DEA) will be teaming up once again to give the public the opportunity to prevent pill misuse and theft by ridding their homes of potentially dangerous expired, unused and unwanted prescription drugs. Visitors are asked to bring medications for safe disposal to North Haven Fire Headquarters located at 11 Broadway. The service is free and anonymous, with no questions asked. This is the 24th National DEA Takeback Day, with collection events taking place every April and October.

This is a drive through drop-off event. Visitors simply need to pull down the driveway of Fire Headquarters and drive around to the back of the building, where they will be greeted by staff to accept the medications. Visitors will be asked to remain in their vehicles and to hand the medications through the window to the staff. Visitors are discouraged from exiting their vehicles or walking up to the disposal tables. Vapes and other e-cigarette devices or cartridges are also now being accepted; please remove the batteries before dropping these items off for safe disposal. Items that will not be accepted include syringes, needles or other sharps, inhalers, such as those for asthma, aerosol cans, mercury thermometers, iodine-containing medications and illegal drugs or substances (including marijuana which is still a schedule 1 drug under federal law).

Please leave all medications in their original containers if possible. Cross out the person's name with a black marker to ensure privacy.
