Taking Back Unwanted Prescription Drugs On Saturday, April 27th at Fire Headquarters from 10am – 2pm

The Town of North Haven and the Drug Enforcement Agency (DEA) will be teaming up once again to give the public the opportunity to prevent pill misuse and theft by ridding their homes of potentially dangerous expired, unused and unwanted prescription drugs. Visitors are asked to bring medications for safe disposal to North Haven Fire Headquarters located at 11 Broadway. The service is free and anonymous, with no questions asked. This is the 24th National DEA Takeback Day, with collection events taking place every April and October.

This is a drive through drop-off event. Visitors simply need to pull down the driveway of Fire Headquarters and drive around to the back of the building, where they will be greeted by staff to accept the medications. Visitors will be asked to remain in their vehicles and to hand the medications through the window to the staff. Visitors are discouraged from exiting their vehicles or walking up to the disposal tables.

Vapes and other e-cigarette devices or cartridges are also now being accepted; please remove the batteries before dropping these items off for safe disposal. Items that will not be accepted include syringes, needles or other sharps, inhalers, such as those for asthma, aerosol cans, mercury thermometers, iodine-containing medications and illegal drugs or substances (including marijuana which is still a schedule 1 drug under federal law).

Please leave all medications in their original containers if possible. Cross out the person's name with a black marker to ensure privacy.

Mission Team Spotlight

The Mission Team Spotlight this week is the Floral Mission Team. Sue Tibor coordinates special flowers and decorations for the sanctuary to make the church welcoming and to enhance the beauty of the space. Special flowers are arranged in the chancel in front of the communion table. This includes poinsettias for Christmas Eve, palms for Palm Sunday, lilies for Easter and the week before Thanksgiving, Sue sets up a cornucopia with vegetables and autumn decorations. Church members add fruits and vegetables to the cornucopia during that Sunday's worship that are donated later. Sue ensures that the lilies and poinsettias are delivered to homebound and recently bereaved church members and cards are written to accompany the flowers. Sue also decorates the sanctuary window sills with candles during Advent and other seasonal decorations. John Tibor also assists Sue at times. There are also wreaths during Advent, and seasonal Spring wreaths to arrange. The flowers on the communion table are not coordinated by the Floral Mission Team, those flowers are donated and arranged by church members, often in honor of someone or in memory of loved ones. Those flowers are recommended to be low and wide arrangements, not tall arrangements, as they are usually placed in front of our cross.
