One of my favorite summer activities was sailing. Our family kept a small boat – a 22-foot Flying Scot – on a trailer at a sailing center on the shore of Galveston Bay. My parents enjoyed sailing together in college, and they wanted our family to sail together. My brother and I had done some sailing at summer camp, and we all took a short introductory course offered by the Coast Guard Auxilliary. We developed a family routine of loading the car with a picnic lunch and drinks along with the sailbags and rigging. We'd drive to the sailing center on Saturday morning and wash down the boat and rig her up. We'd launch the boat and walk out the long gangway to raise the sails and set off. The sailing center held races, and we became a good crew – watching the water, trimming the sails, and leaning out over the edge to keep the boat more level in a strong breeze. It was wonderful to be out on

the water in the breeze and the spray, watching the fish jump and the birds dive. After the races and the picnic lunch, there was the work of stowing the sails and the gear and washing the boat down. There was usually time for a swim in the afternoon. Whatever special memories the summer brings for you -or whatever memories you set out to make - I wish you a joyous, relaxing, and adventurous summer!

"The Church Never Sleeps"

As you are reading this, some of you are busy making summer vacation plans, booking cruises or airline flights, or maybe reserving a little quite time at a favorite hideaway removed from your day to day routines.

At the church, however, Scott, and Julie, and Dave have their usual tasks to perform. Sermons must be written and pastoral visits scheduled; weekly bulletins must be put together, monthly newsletter collated, and phone calls answered or properly directed; and our church's Sanctuary, Carroll Hall, kitchen, and many other rooms must be regularly cleaned. The church never sleeps.

And with these assigned tasks come the required compensation, while other costs associated with running any property continue (electric, water, insurance, office expenses, grounds maintenance, repairs, etc.). So even if you plan to take the summer off from regular, in-person Sunday worship, please recognize the importance of maintaining your regular pledge payments. The church never sleeps.

On another subject, I became involved in the Food Pantry Council (the body which coordinates the holiday food drives and oversees the day-to-day operations of the food pantry) last fall and have been very impressed by the dedication of these volunteers, who represent many of North Haven's churches. The subject was raised at a recent meeting that whereas the Community Services Food Bank has regular articles published in the local papers concerning specific items it is in need of, our food pantry has been remiss in this regard. We are determined to correct that situation.

Additionally, for as long as I can remember, we encouraged church members to bring in non-perishable foodstuffs on the first Sunday of every month, with filled baskets brought to the front of the Sanctuary during the offering. We seem to have gotten away from that tradition. What I would like to propose is that members of the Food Pantry Council from this church promote to the congregation the weekly donation of several specific items in the monthly Window that are in particular need. For example, they could ask congregants to bring in mayonnaise and peanut butter in July, and to donate pasta and soups in August. Just an idea, but I hope we'll try it.

2024 has the potential to be a very good one for North Haven Congregational Church. We have a wonderful staff in place, complemented by a committed and talented choir and a small but dedicated core of church members willing to perform the necessary weekly worship tasks and significant mission team responsibilities.

What will make 2024 an even better one will be YOUR personal involvement in church affairs going forward, be it as a Deacon, a Greeter, a Coffee Hour Host, or a Mission Team Member (you pick your interest). As you enjoy your summers, please pledge to return to NHCC in September committed to becoming more involved in the activities of the church. In the interim, please keep your pledges current. Thank you.

Ministry Coordinator for Children Family Sunday's during July and August

During the months of July and August, the first and third Sundays will be a Family Sunday. There will be lectionary-based Children's Worship Bulletins (or leaflets) available for use by the children during each worship service. The worship bulletins utilize childfriendly language to provide engaging activities, such as puzzles, games, coloring, and word searches which encourage the children's active listening during worship. Each bulletin reinforces the day's scripture and/or church seasons.

Each week's scripture are as follows:

7/07 - Mark 6: 1-13; Jesus Sends the Twelve

7/21 - Mark 6: 30-34, 53-56; Jesus Heals the Crowds 8/4 - John 6: 24-35; Bread of Life

8/18 - Ephesians 5:15-20; Make Melody to the Lord

This year, **Summer Sunday School** days are scheduled for July 14 & 28; and August 11 & 25; the

second and fourth Sundays of each month. The focus this year will be one hero, and four heroines of the Bible: Miriam and Moses (July 14); Esther (July 28); Dorcas (August 11); and Lydia (August 25). Miriam and Moses', and Esther's stories are found in the Old Testament; Dorcas' and Lydia's stories are found in the New Testament. Each lesson about the day's hero or heroine will include various activities such as handcrafts, songs, rhymes, or a skits. Priscilla Noreiga, Sara Gannon and Jackie Jennings will team-up to teach Church school. THANK YOU to all three for providing a fun and enriching Summer Church School program for our children.

Summer Bible Reading Bingo

This summer, each family has been given a Summer Bible Reading Bingo packet to provide some quiet, but valuable family time while motivating the children to read their Bibles during the summer and stay connected with God. It proves to be a fun, valuable resource to help the children learn how to use their Bibles, learn more Bible stories, learn more about God, and help with their reading skills.

Each family packet includes Summer Bible Reading Bingo cards for selected stories found in both the Old and New Testament, for either preschool (Ages 4/5) and/or elementary (K-7th grade), depending on the age of the children in each family. Each age-level packet includes a total of 24 Bible stories for each part of the Bible (for a total of 48 stories). The children may read as much of the Bible as they want, but for this game of Bingo, it is suggested that they read only one story each day. When they have read their selection of the story for the day, they may mark off the story read using the multi-colored stickers provided.

On Rally Day (September 8th), the official start of the new church school year, we will acknowledge all the children who completed a portion of, or their entire Summer Bible Reading Bingo cards. A special gift will be provided for each child in celebration of his or her summer Bible reading. After Church NHCC will celebrate the start of a new school year with an ALL-CHURCH luncheon. It's a time to re-connect with friends and church family, enjoying casual conversation, and family games.

Organ Chimes To Be Repaired

When the organ was tuned for Christmas in December of last year, it was discovered that the chimes assembly connected to the organ had detached from the ceiling of the organ chamber and fallen to the ground. There was damage to the chimes assembly and to some organ pipes.

After much discussion, it has been agreed that the organ tuners, Foley-Baker Inc., will replace the chimes in the organ chamber, as well as the damaged pipes. The chime assembly, which had been originally installed in the 1940s, was repaired by church member Peter Struk. Our insurance will cover almost all of the cost of reinstallation. The work will begin on July 8, and Martin Benassi will oversee the project. Special thanks to Jeff Hutchins, Martin Benassi, Peter Struk, and the Building & Grounds Mission Team and the Ministry Leadership Board for their assistance.

Southern New England Conference UCC Annual Meeting

The 5th Annual Meeting of the Southern New England Conference of the United Church of Christ was held on Friday and Saturday, June 21-22 on the campus of the University of Masschusetts in Amherst, MA. There were some advance events on Friday, including a tour of the Ancestral Bridges Exhibit celebrating the history of Black and Indigenous people in Western Massachusetts at Frost Library on the UMASS campus, and a screecing of the 2022 documentary "It Takes a Village" recounting the design and construction of the Village at West Jefferson in Louisville, KY. The Village offers 30,000 square feet of social services, businesses, a bank branch, and more, located in a former church parking lot! The theme for the Annual Meeting was "Growing the Church". The keynote speaker was the Rev. Dr. Courtney Stange-Tregear, Chief Relationship Officer at the Cornerstone Fund of the UCC. She spoke about "God Math" and shared inspiring stories of churches that have grown their ministries - and more greatly affected their communities - with the assistance of the Cornerstone Fund and the UCC Church Building Loan Fund.. Dr. Erica Dollhopf, Director of the UCC Center for Analytics, Research & Development and Data (CARDD) will gave a presentation on recent research on congregational vitality in the UCC and beyond.

It was inspiring and invigorating to be among the gathering of delegates from over 475 churches. The worship and music were particulary energizing, and the Rev. Dr. Darrel Goodwin, Escecutive Minister of the SNEUCC, was a captivating preacher.

Moderator Sandy Carter and Scott Morrow attended in person, and Kerry Stewart attended virtually. We brought back the new board game developed by Dr. Erica Dollhopf and others, "Grow Your Church". We will offer opportunities to play the game together!
