Thank you to Members of the Building and Grounds Mission Team


I would like to use this column to give a shout out to my fellow building and grounds mission team members and the endless list of repairs and projects they attack. They are everything from plumbing, electrical, heating and cooling, electronics, etc. The list goes on. The members of the B&G team tackle all of these problems as they arise, many times at a moment's notice. A much larger project, the replacement of the parking lot and upgrading of the drainage, is currently being quoted by various vendors, based on information from the team. While the majority of the things done by the team are done only incurring material costs, the parking lot is going to require a capital campaign for funding. This project is long overdue. We are constantly filling potholes to try to provide some safety until this project gets done.

Another project in the works is the replacement of numerous lights to modern LED lighting. This is a project being funded mostly by United Illuminating Company and grants from the State of Connecticut. A small portion may need to be provided by the church at 0% interest. This is still in the planning stage.

The members of this team are Mark Bessette, Paul Powers, Peter Struck, David Nelson, Martin Benassi and myself. If you see any of them, be sure to thank them for the ongoing volunteer services they provide keeping our church safe and in good shape. 

Church Safety Team Hears Recommendations

Following a Church Safety Webinar offered by the Southern New England Conference UCC last fall, a group has come together to consider ways to enhance security and safety in our Church. Addressing concern for both intruders disrupting church activities and potential aggression and violence, there are recommendations of improvements to facilities and training for Greeters and Church leaders. The Safcty Team met with North Haven Police officers on two occasions. The officers made several suggestions for improvements to the building, including numbering the outside entrances for easy identification, providing the Police Department with keys and codes for access to a specific door; upgrading the locks on exterior doors to electronic locks using fobs or a code and potential upgrades to the alarm system.

Additional recommendations concerned training for Greeters who are often the first to meet visitors, and for leaders, to help develop a communication system to share awareness of any concern or incident.

The Team will work with the Building & Grounds Mission Team to implement changes the building, and with the MLB to implement the needed training. The group will also pursue the availability of grants to cover the cost of improvements and enhancements.

Parking Lot Campaign Committee Forming

There has been extended discussion among the Ministry Leadership Board (MLB) and the Building & Grounds Team around the development of a plan to improve drainage in the church parking lot and resurface the lot. There is no drainage currently, so water flows across the lot and creates weak points and potholes. A two-step process beginning with installation of pipes and catch basins, followed by resurfacing, is anticipated. While there are many questions still to be answered and details to be checked, the cost of this project is estimated to be about \$200,000. The MLB is forming a committee to guide this project and conduct a capital campaign to raise the needed funds. A significant gift has already been received, and others are anticipated, along with a contribution from the Corinthian Lodge next door. We will keep the congregation updated on this project.
