There are members who serve on the Building & Grounds Mission Team. They keep our Church building in good repair and do much of the work themselves.

They have also been working on a drainage and pavement plan for our Church parking lot as they continue to fill in the potholes. Proposals are being received and we are proceeding with a Capital Parking Lot Campaign to raise funds for this major and necessary improvement.

To serve others in immediate need, we have our Food Pantry. We have volunteers from our Church, volunteers from our community and volunteers from other churches who sort, pack and give out the boxes of food. The Food Council is beginning to prepare for the Holiday Food Drive and will be in need of additional food items and volunteers. This is an opportunity for our Church members to provide specific food items and to bring them to Church each week.

There are Men and Women Fellowships who raise needed funds through various activities throughout the year. We ask the Congregation to support and attend these activities and have some fun and fellowship. There are members who give rides to those who want to attend Church service each week. Some call or visit members who are shut in or not feeling well. They reach out to someone who needs some care, some hope or maybe just a hello. Pastor Scott is involved with pastoral care in hospitals and nursing facilities.

Our Ministry Leadership Board meets with Pastor Scott each month to plan church activities and oversee the business of the Church. We have a Church Treasurer and Endowment Trustee and Church Clerk. Everyone volunteers their time and talents to serve God and our Congregation.

I also want to thank Pastor Scott for his leadership and our Church Staff who diligently perform their duties.

In closing, I want to say thank you to all the members

who pledge each year to support our Church and to those members who donate to the offering each week. It is this support that sustains our Church and all that we do for others.

Please consider if you have the time or a special talent to volunteer in some of these activities, please speak to us in Church or contact the Church office. There is an empty seat waiting for you. If you know of someone or a family in the community who needs food, please let us know. We will be collecting socks for the needy and perhaps you can donate.

There are so many opportunities to make a difference in someone's life. When we participate in our Church and Community activities, we are following God's teaching to love and serve Jesus and each other. We pray for each other; we share and give to those in need, and we thank God for his blessings.

Notes from the Fire Drill

A fire drill was held on Sunday, Sept. 8. It was scheduled purposely on a Sunday when children would be in their Sunday classes. The building was fully cleared in about 4 minutes – determined by when the two people acting as Sweepers reported to the church sign after checking all the rooms in the building. Several things were noted for the next fire drill: a parent went to the Nursery to get their child, rather than leaving the building and waiting at the church sign while the designated adults helped to evacuate the Nursery; doors to all rooms in the church should be closed when they have been checked by sweepers; and ... it took too long to shut off the fire alarm. We will make sure we do these things differently next time. Thanks to everyone for their cheerful cooperation on Rally Day Sunday!

Parking Lot Campaign Committee Will Meet

The MLB received a design and project proposal to improve drainage in the church parking lot through the installation of pipes and catch basins. This will be the first step in the parking lot improvement plan, to be followed by resurfacing. The estimated cost for the drainage project is \$25,200, and the estimated cost of resurfacing is approximately \$160,000.

The Parking Lot Campaign Committee will meet in October to plan the campaign to raised the funds needed for this project. A significant leadership gift has already been received and others have been pledged. We also anticipate a significant contribution from our neighbors at the Corinthian Lodge. It is anticipated that the drainage project will be completed this fall! e will keep the congregation updated on the project and the campaign.



Church Safety Team Met on Sept 25

The Church Safety Team met Wednesday, Sept 25, for the first time. The agenda included Team organization and review of the recommendations from the North Haven Police Department. These recommendations include enhancements to building security, such as locking/entry system and alarm system, and development of procedures and training for the congregation. Information was provided by the Insurance Board through the assistance of the Church's insurance agent. The Church Safety Team will work with the Ministry Leadership Board and the Building & Grounds Team and report to the congregation on its work.

2024-2025 Connecticut Energy Assistance Program Starts in North Haven Oct. 2nd

Starting October 2nd, the Town of North Haven's Community Services office will begin conducting residents' appointments for the CT energy assistance program (CEAP). Energy assistance appointments are available by phone on Tuesdays and Wednesdays from 9am-11:15am.

Confirm your eligibility

Eligibility is based on total income of household members. Call 203-239-2566 to see if you qualify.

Gather your energy documents

You will need a copy of your most recent electric bill (and gas bill if applicable), or a copy of your rental lease showing that your heat is included in your rent.

Gather your income documents

If you or anyone in your household currently receives benefits such as SNAP or cash assistance, you automatically meet the income requirements and do not need to provide income documents.

If your household does not qualify for SNAP, you must provide income for all household members. Income includes: wages, self-employed work (e.g., freelancer, side-gigger, contractor, small business owner), Pension income, or any additional income, you must provide award letter(s) and/or signed statements, such as benefit verification letters for Social Security, unemployment or veterans' benefits, contributions from friends/relatives, pensions or annuities, rental income or alimony, child support or adoption benefits.

*Please note: Energy assistance determinations take forty-five (45) business days. For further explanation, to see if you qualify or to schedule your phone appointment, call Community Services at (203) 239-2566 from 9:00am-4:00pm, Monday through Friday.

Neighbors In Need Offering set for Oct. 6

On Sunday, October 6, we will receive the Neighbors In Need Offering for 2024. The Neighbors In Need offering is an all-church special offering across the United Church of Christ. The theme for this year's NIN Offering is "Mental Health Justice for All: Mental Health is a Universal Right!". This follows the 2015 General Synod resolution to become a WISE Church- welcoming, inclusive, supportive, and engaged – for mental health.

The offering supports the United Church of Christ ministries of justice and compassion throughout the United States. Two-thirds of the offering is used by the UCC's Justice and Witness Ministries to fund a wide array of local and national justice initiatives, advocacy efforts, and direct service projects.

Today there are 20 UCC congregations on reservations and one urban, multi-tribal UCC congregation in Minneapolis, Minnesota. These churches and their pastors are supported by CAIM. CAIM is also an invaluable resource for more than 1,000 individuals from dozens of other tribes and nations who are members of other UCC congregations in the U.S. I encourage you to give prayerfully and generously. First Aid Course Offered October 17


Learn how to provide life-saving help in an emergency. The Church will offer a class called "Stop the Bleed and Hands Only CPR:" This is a two-

The Town of North Haven and the Drug Enforcement Agency will offer the public the opportunity to safely dispose of potentially dangerous,

expired, unused, and unwanted prescription drugs.

This event will take place at North Haven Fire Headquarters at 11 Broadway. This service is free and anonymous, with no questions asked. This is a dropoff event. Visitors simply pull down the driveway of Fire Headquarters and drive around the back of the building, where they will be greeted by staff to accept the medications. Visitors will be asked to stay in their vehicles and hand the medications through the window.
