Jesus & Women Bible Study

"For where two or three are gathered together in my name, there am I in the midst of them". Matthew 18:20

On Monday September 15th three women gathered in the Library to begin a Bible Study using the book "Jesus & Women In the First Century and Now". This study uses seven video teaching sessions and seven follow up discussion sessions. The videos sessions were recorded at a presentation by Kristi McLelland, a speaker, teacher and college professor who has completed her Masters of Arts in Christian Education at Dallas Theological Seminary. She has dedicated her life to discipleship, to teaching people how to study the Bible themselves, and to writing about how God is better than we ever knew by explaining the Bible through a Middle Eastern lens.

We will meet in the Library at 4:00 on Mondays and watch the videos together on a laptop followed by a brief discussion. The following Monday we will meet to discuss the video we saw using questions from the book. With the purchase of the book you will have access to the

videos which then can be viewed at your convenience. The book has readings, study guide questions and pages for notes. Ladies are still welcome and encouraged to join in this study. 
FOOD PANTRY NEEDS


