



THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

Baptism is a moment in the Christian community when we recognize the grace of God living in each newborn creation.

GREETING

Minister: Friends in Christ, we who are here in person and in Spirit

gather today to celebrate the gift of grace in the sacrament

of baptism.

People: There is one body and one Spirit. There is one hope

in God's call to us. There is one Lord, one faith, one

Baptism, one God and Creator of us all.

ADDRESS

Minister:

From the start of the Christian community centuries ago, people have been received into the church through baptism. Baptism is a sign that God loves each one of us individually. It shows and tells us that God's love encompasses and embraces us all and that God's grace works in and through our lives. The water we use in baptism is thus a seal of God's grace and reminds us of Jesus Christ, who was himself baptized, buried and raised that we might know life in all its fullness. The water is sprinkled, poured out – like God's Spirit – on us and for us all so we are reminded and assured that we are all God's children, that our future lies with God, and that the church, the family of God, is where we will be helped and equipped to serve God in the world.

are able?

Minister: Do you promise, according to the grace given you to grow

with Weston in the Christian faith, to help him to be a

faithful member of the church of Jesus Christ, by

celebrating Christ's presence, by furthering Christ's

mission in all the world, and by offering the nurture of the

Christian church so that one day she may affirm this

baptism?

Bless this water as Weston is baptized into your family.




