A note from the Moderator

Happy New Year to our Congregation! I am looking forward to 2025 being a time of new goals and opportunities to continue to grow our Church and to follow the teachings of Jesus to help others.

The Ministry Leadership Board is preparing for the Annual Meeting on Sunday, January 26th. We will present the Annual Report and Church Budget for 2025. One of our biggest goals is for the Parking lot Campaign Committee to raise funds for the paving of our lot. The drainage work has been completed and funds were donated to cover the costs for this part of the project. This is a major undertaking for our Congregation.

We will be planning fundraisers throughout 2025 and are putting together a calendar of potential events. More to come on this as we proceed into the year. I thank all our Mission Teams for their work throughout the year. I had the opportunity to attend their meetings and saw all they do to keep our Church working. Each month a different Mission Team met with the Ministry Leadership Board to discuss their activities. The Teams also spoke to the Congregation throughout the year. We have established a Church Safety Team and met with an officer of the North Haven Police Department to update safety procedures and protocol in Church. We had a fire drill in the fall and will schedule another in the spring. We will also have training for Safe Conduct Procedures as per our Safe Conduct Policy.

The Food Pantry in conjunction with other North Haven Churches has been busy all year especially during the holidays. It provides food to families throughout the year. Thank you to everyone who donated food and funds to the Pantry and to the many volunteers who work in the Pantry.

An energy audit was completed for the church and new energy saving lighting was installed at no cost to the Church. The Building and Grounds Team have been busy all year keeping our Church repaired and overseeing the drainage work for the parking lot and keeping the pot holes filled.

Our Faith Formation Team continues to work with the children throughout the year. We just enjoyed the annual Children's Christmas Pageant. The children

conduct the Noisy Offering for their Heifer Project. We are fortunate to have dedicated teachers.

On Sundays, it is a pleasure to hear the organ played and the beautiful voices of our Choir led by the Music Director and organist. This past year our organ was repaired and recently tuned. We also enjoyed the Children's Choir.

It has been an honor to serve as your Moderator. I have had the opportunity to work with Pastor Scott, our Church Staff, the Ministry Leadership Board and the Church Mission Teams. I enjoyed meeting members of the Congregation especially at coffee hour.

I look forward to this new year to continue the work of our Church. I thank everyone who has pledged support so we can meet to worship each week and operate our Church. We are a vital part of our community. We will continue to support others in need through the Food Pantry, clothing collections, gifts to children and other events.

From the Music Director

Given that our main Christmas anthem has permeated the soul of the Chancel Choir for the last few weeks, I thought it would be nice to pay respects to a titan of modern church music who wrote both the music and text to that anthem. Natalie Sleeth (1930–1992) was a gifted American composer known for her inspiring sacred choral works. Celebrated for her lyrical melodies and heartfelt original texts, her music continues to enrich worship and bring communities together into the 21st century. She is prolific in works of both school and church choirs.

This Christmas, we are enjoying her classic, "Were You There That Christmas Night?". This cherished anthem reflects on the wonder of Christ's birth with her singable melody and poignant lyrics, making it a favorite for many church choirs during the holiday season... but somewhat new to us!

Natalie Sleeth is also known for her "Hymn of Promise - (In the Bulb There Is a Flower)," which explores themes of hope and resurrection with references to both natural and miraculous phenomena. Written in 1986, it has become a beloved hymn, often sung at celebrations of life, weddings, and moments of reflection.

Over her lifetime, Sleeth composed more than 200 accessible and inspiring pieces, blending deep faith with musical creativity. Works like "Joy in the Morning" and "Canon of Praise" remain staples in church and school choirs.

Born on October 29, 1930, in Evanston, Illinois, Sleeth earned a degree in music theory from Wellesley College. She balanced family life with her passion for composing, creating over 200 works that reflected her deep faith and spirituality. She passed away from cancer on March 21, 1992, leaving behind her husband Ron and a legacy of sacred music that continues to uplift and inspire worshippers all around the world.
